


# APSE Scotland Annual General Meeting 2021

#### About the AGM

APSE's Scottish chair, Vice chair and Advisory group chairs are elected at AGM and you should note that each post carries with it a personal allowance of £1,100 per annum (Scottish Chair £5,100 per annum). - Wide representation of member authorities, with each appointment being made to a different member authority. This will ensure that APSE Scotland has a fair and true representation within all its committees.
