## What happened to the Spending Review?



#### Public Finance 5 June 2019:

The Spending Review is unlikely to start before parliament's summer recess, chief secretary to the Treasury Liz Truss has told the Lords economic affairs committee......

"The plan had been to launch the Spending Review...just before the summer recess," Truss told the Lords.


"I would suggest that's unlikely to happen given the current timetable for the <u>Conservative leadership election</u>, and in fact although we will need to set revenue budgets (for 2020-21) we do already have capital budgets for 2020-21," she said.

The announcement comes after chancellor Philip Hammond said in April that he thought it would be <u>"unwise" to set a three-year Spending Review</u> before the outcome of Brexit was clear.

## **Continued funding reductions**




#### Change in Funding since 2009-10



## Local services bearing the brunt.....




#### Service spend change since 2009-10

### Reform Working Group



- Set up following Green Paper in Summer 2018
- Chaired by Derek Vaughan
- Members included the Minister for Local Government (Alun Davies AM and then Julie James AM), WLGA leadership (cross-party) with representatives from unions, business and third sector
- The group concluded its work in May 2019.

### **Reform Working Group**



- There is no report (nor was there due to be one), but a series of recommendations were made.
- WLGA Members agreed these recommendations at Executive Board (leaders) on 24<sup>th</sup> May and ratified by WLGA Council on 14<sup>th</sup> June 2019.
- Bilateral reform discussions will continue through a new Sub-Committee of the Partnership Council (inc. Minister and WLGA members: Cllr Debbie Wilcox (Newp), Rob Stewart (Swan), Andrew Morgan (RCT), Huw Thomas (Card), Hugh Evans (Den), Ellen ap Gwynn (Cere), Mair Stephens (Carms), Sam Rowlands (Conwy)

### **Reform Working Group - Progress**



- Renewed commitment to partnership governance, dialogue and engagement
- Commitment to revised approach to early dialogue and engagement around finances, including a new framework to outline mechanisms and expectations
- Agreed 'Underpinning Principles of Collaboration'
- Collaboration Compendium
- Agreed draft Prospectus for Voluntary Mergers
- Agreed to Joint Review of Strategic Partnerships
- Commitment to re-establish sector-led improvement support within WLGA
- Statutory Joint Committees
