Partnership between LWARB and WRAP

By 2020, London will have more harmonised, consistent and efficient waste and recycling services that will:

- Reduce the city's waste footprint and reinvigorate recycling to make a significant contribution towards the Mayor's ambition for London to achieve 65% recycling by 2030; and
- make a significant contribution towards England achieving its 50% household waste recycling target in 2020.



What is the Cost of Contamination toolkit?

- Free online toolkit to help measure the true cost of contamination
- Measures reactive costs incurred by authorities, including:
 - Gate fees
 - Staffing
 - Communications
 - Extra contactor fees

Purpose is to:

- Calculate the true cost of contamination in the recycling stream
- Provide officers with evidence to secure internal resources and funding to help tackle the issue
- Provide in-depth service information for reporting to members



Why was it developed?

- Contamination in recycling is a big issue for London boroughs
- Financial and performance implications for authorities
- Research (e.g. borough visits, LROG workshop) showed authorities did not appreciate the true cost of contamination
- Inconsistent approach to measuring the cost to the authority





How was the toolkit developed?

- Resource London and LEDNET commissioned Anthesis (a specialist sustainability consultancy) to develop the toolkit
- The structure and functionality of the toolkit was informed by discussions with Resource London, a working group (including local authority representatives, LARAC, WRAP and the ESA)
- 5 boroughs trialled the toolkit testing different collection methodologies









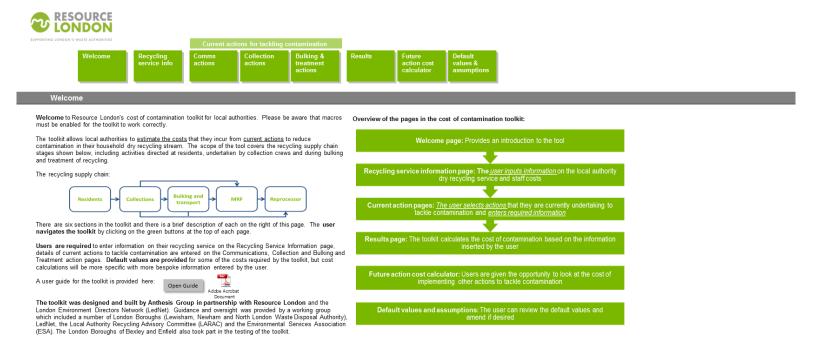
