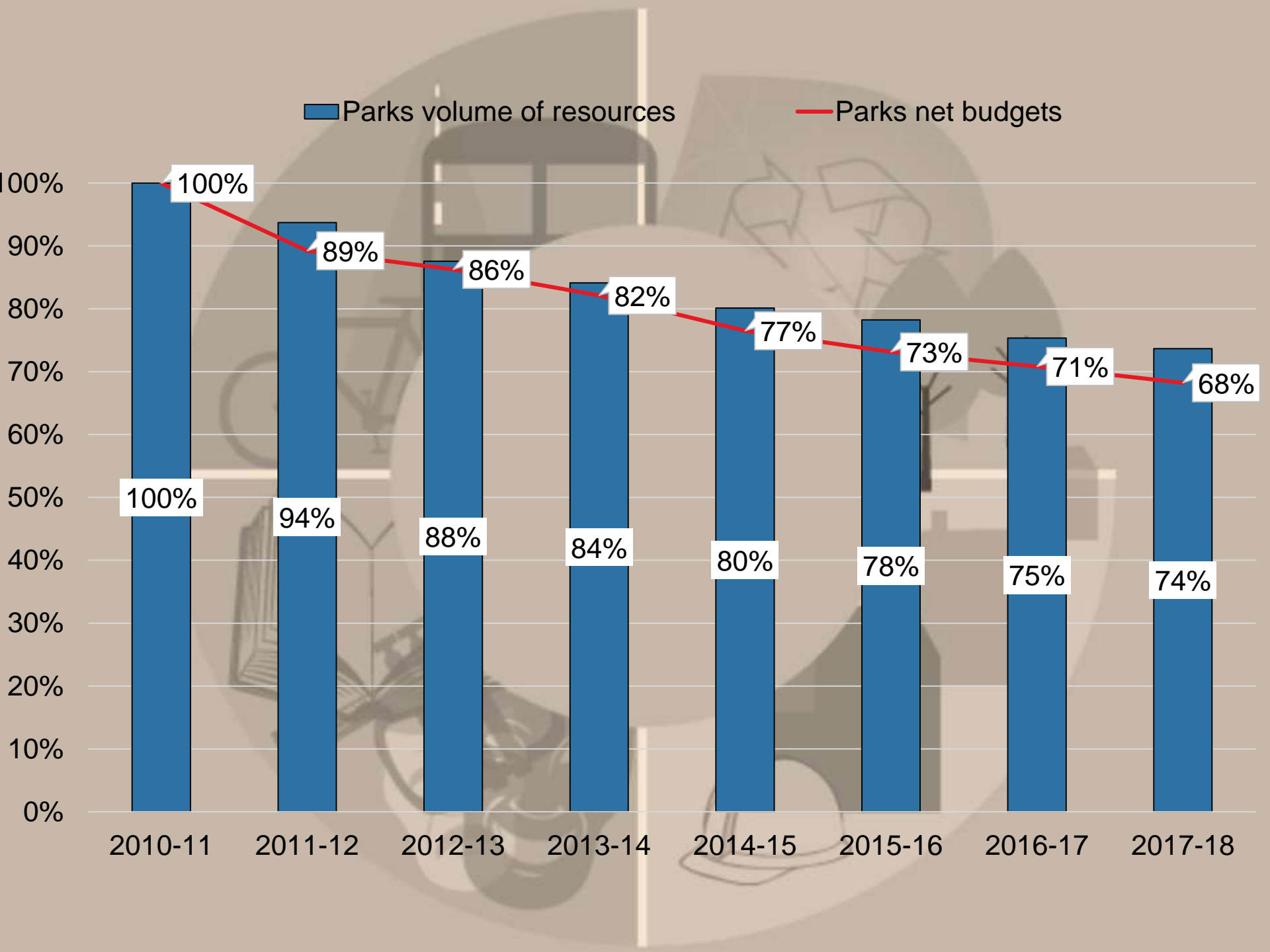


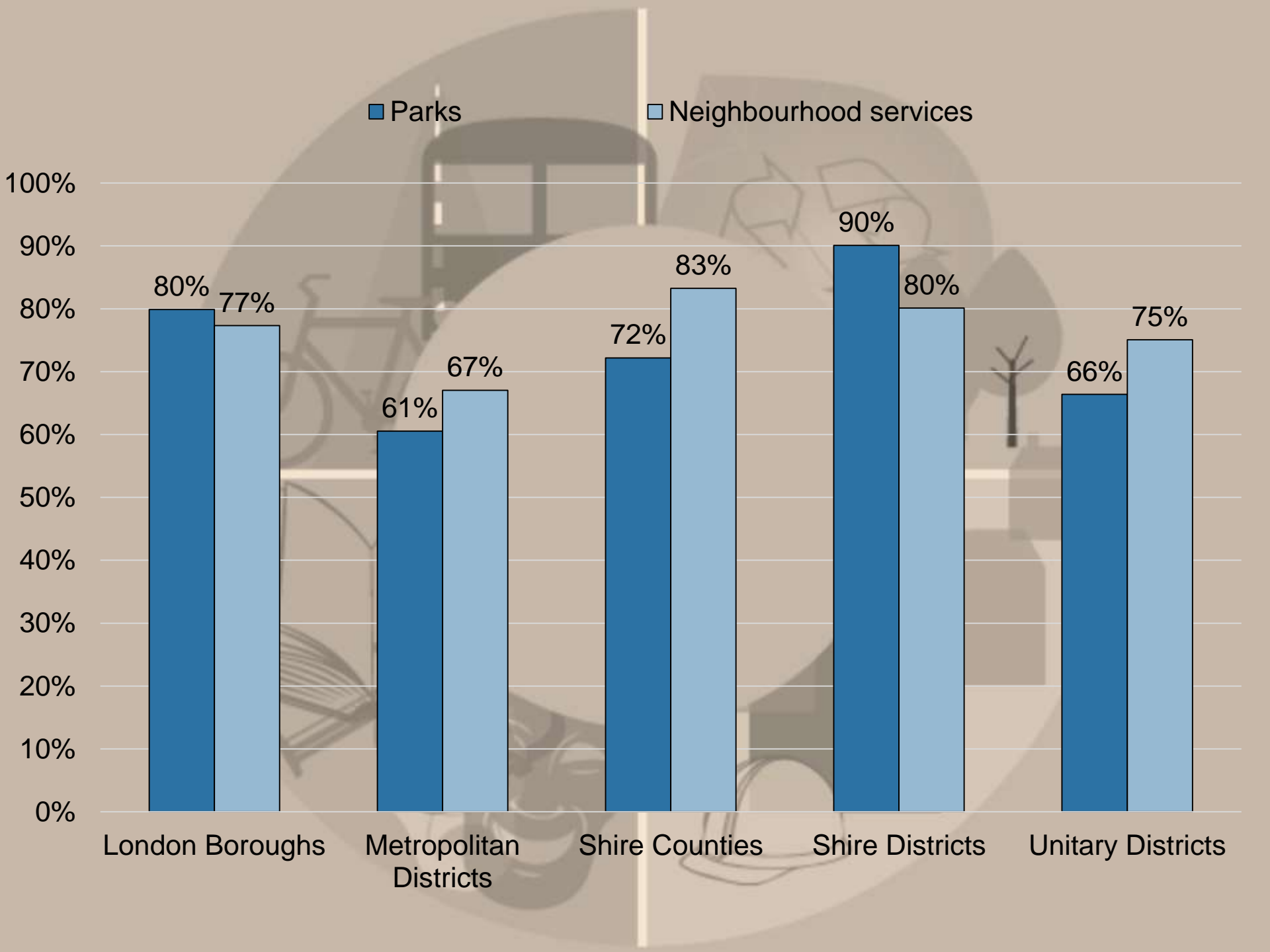

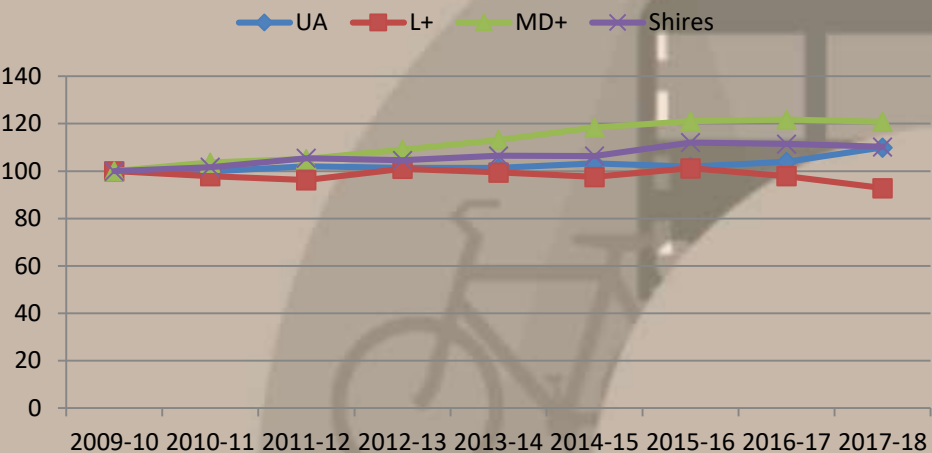

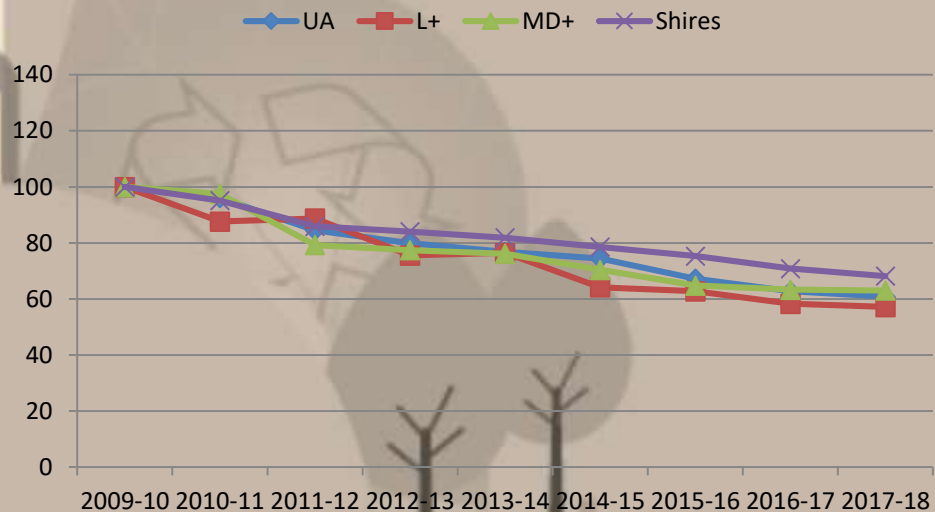

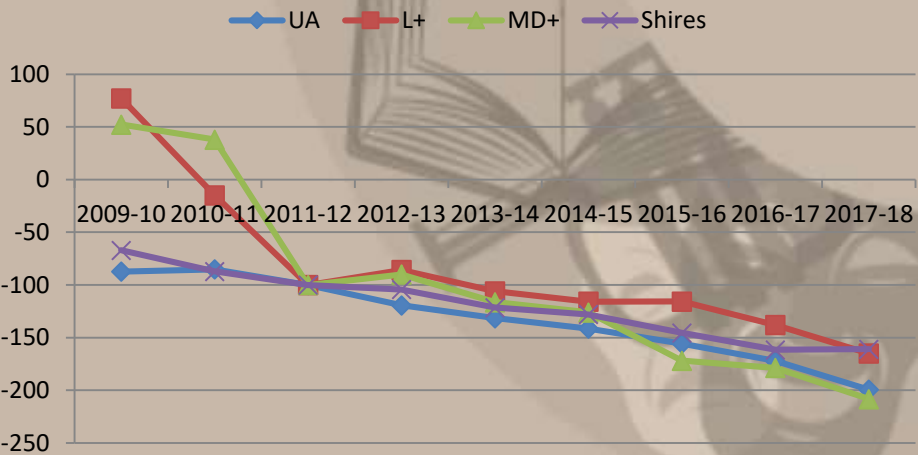
Net Expenditure on waste collection, disposal and recycling



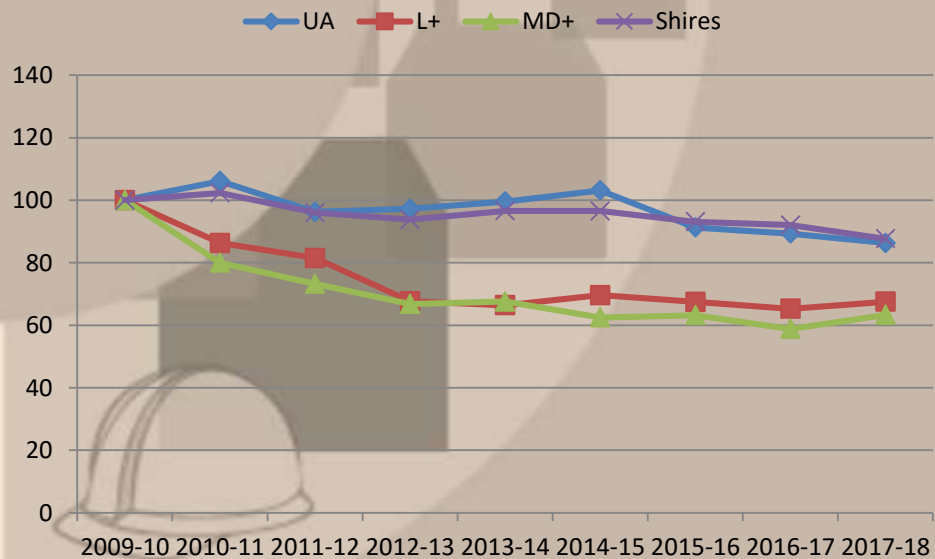
Net Expenditure Other Neighbourhood services (Ex waste, public transport, planning, parking)

Net Expenditure on Public transport support

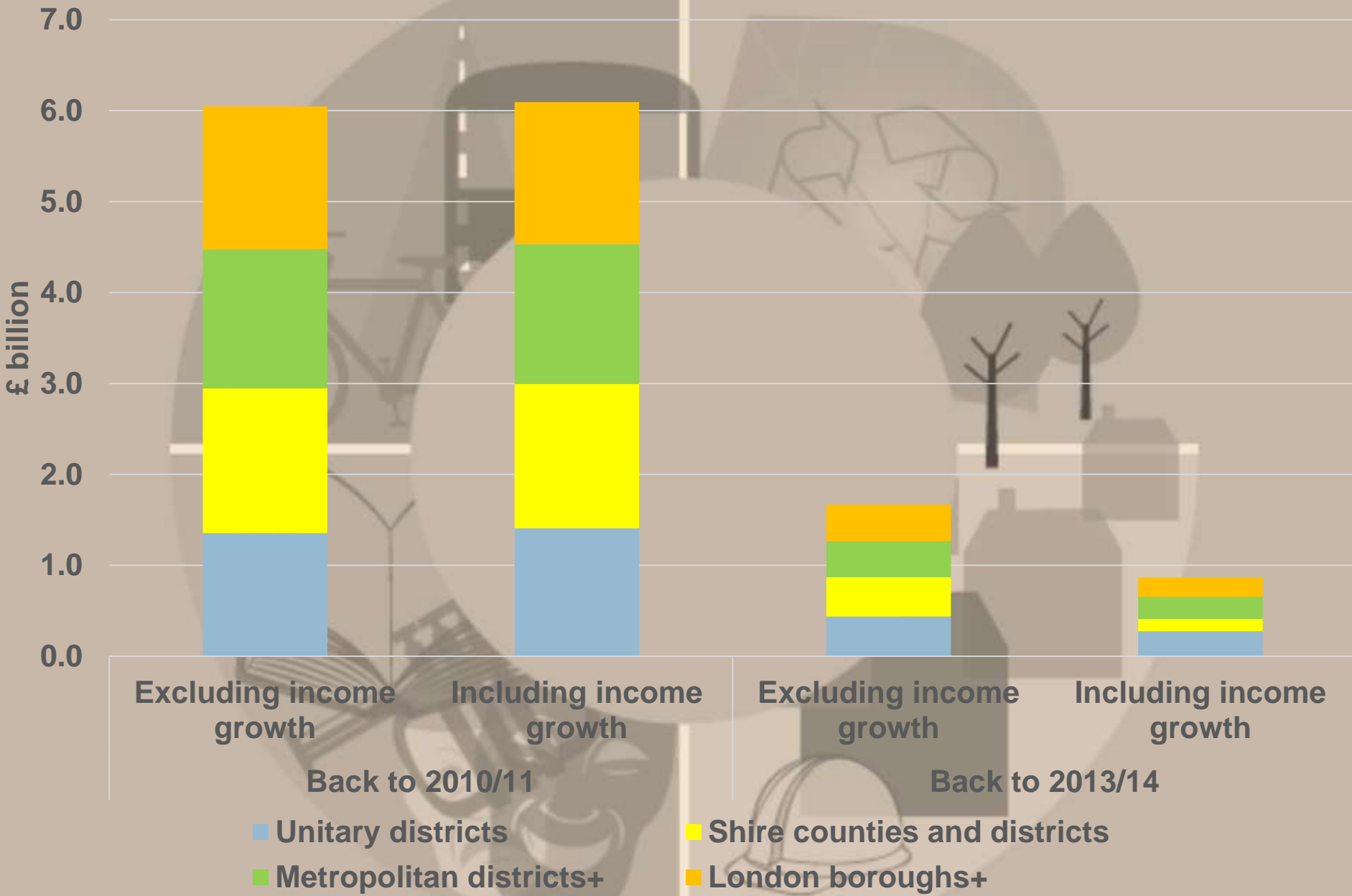
