Lessons from the grave


- What can one of the world's oldest cemeteries teach us?
- Jebel Sahaba 13,000 year old cemetery. on the Nile Valley
- Believed to be one of earliest example of a war grave.
- Remains show signs of injuries from spears and arrows.
- Burials result of a single battle.
- Now found not to be the case.
- Raids and skirmishes over months possibly years caused by


CLIMATE CHANGE



State of the Markets Findings


- Only 40% of respondents felt Bereavement Services have had disproportionate funding cuts compared to other services (35% in 2021).
- <u>But</u> 90%, feel that the lack of investment in cemeteries and crematoria will impact on the quality of future service delivery.
- 62% of respondents have experienced reductions in the manicured quality of their grounds.
- Yet 92% felt that there was a limit to involving volunteers in maintaining cemetery land.





Budgets


- Three-quarters expect changes to current budgets in next twelve months.
- 25% expect increases in capital or revenue
- 47% expect no change
- 28% expect decreases in either capital or revenue.




Service efficiencies.

- Increasing fees and charges
- Differential rates for non-residents
- New and increased memorial offer(e.g. memorial mason services).
- Restructure of service management/staffing levels
- Replacing existing cremators to improve efficiency and generate additional income
- New services e.g. woodland burials, pets cemetery
- Letting out unused cemetery buildings
- Reducing grounds maintenance frequencies
- Consideration of Municipal Funeral Services
- Saturday service provision & early morning /late evening offers
- Solar panels, water collection, heat re-use, LED lighting.
- Accessing grants to improve buildings of historical importance.








Other sources of income

- CAMEO mercury trading payments
- Provision of officer time in assisting other authorities to process Public Health funerals.
- Profit share with music partner.
- Pre-paid cremation service for future use by families.
- Grave digging services for adjoining local authorities
- Leasing of memorials (benches, trees, rose bushes etc.)
- Creating a pets cremation offer.
- Provision of webcasts and recordings of services.
- Provision of jewellery containing ashes.
- Allowing weddings in funeral chapels
- Cave tours in a closed cemetery.





Burial Space


- Next 5-10 Years critical point
- Study found one in four local authorities around the UK have ten years or less before their existing council-owned cemeteries are full to capacity, while almost one in six have five years or less.
- Extensions rather than new sites
- New cemeteries likely to be smaller due to housing demand.
- Many cemeteries now closed with only ashes internments allowed.
- Suitable sites difficult to find.
- Re-use in London cemeteries after 75 years












Service growth/decrease





Conclusions.

- Impacts of Covid now leveling off.
- During Covid support also from street cleansing staff some evidence of **multi-skilling** to cover possible future events.
- Relatively low level of budget cuts compared to other services evidence of future investment with fewer / lower levels of cuts reported.
- Staff levels stabilized concerns about future entrants.
- Still sensitivities over new income generation schemes.
- Burial space set to become a major issue in the next 5-10 years
- Environmental/social/cultural/digitisation considerations growing in importance.
- Concerns over quality of cemetery grounds possible links to naturalised maintenance and opportunities for biodiversity.
- Increased recognition of service value following COVID.
- Challenges ahead but service has learned many lessons.



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
