- relying for its authority on the IPCC's 2018 report ...
- seeing the science as the council's friend ...
- and shifting understanding of exactly what's the goal ...
- using the Committee on Climate Change (CCC) priorities as a framework ...
- and not pulling punches about the hard choices

CCC priorities for 2020s: how could LA's respond?

- <u>Energy efficiency</u> of buildings
- <u>Heat pumps</u> as an established part of the solution
- Public must get it that we must give up <u>natural gas</u>
- \underline{H}_2 production from carbon capture and storage
- Big rise in <u>electric vehicles</u> + supporting infrastructure
- A step increase in tree-planting
- Better <u>diets;</u> more <u>walk/cycle</u>
- An end to biodegradable waste to landfill
