## Challenges - Derry City & Strabane...

- Unemployment /Economic Inactivity
- 32% of the population with no qualifications
- Oversupply of lower skilled residents, demand for higher skills
- Employers have difficulty recruiting
- Lack of work experience, employability skills
- Highly educated young people leaving
- Complexity of existing approaches to employability and skills and the significant duplication

We have a better skilled, educated and flexible work force to stimulate productivity and improve competitiveness


# **Employability?**

- Representation from DEL, DE, Derry City Council, community/voluntary sector, NWRC, Ulster University, INI, Regeneration Forum, Foyle Learning Community, WELB, Chamber, political parties and private sector
- Establishment of a series of Working Groups across <u>key sectors</u>

- Continue to progress the implementation of the Skill action plan through four areas.
  - Tackling Worklessness;
  - Developing Workforce Capacity;
  - Developing Management and Leadership Capacity;
  - Planning Future Skills.
- Ensuring the One Plan/Community Plan ambitions for university growth and skills development are connected to the Executive's Programme for Government post 2015;
- Co-ordinating and facilitating the development and delivery of local, national and EU funded programmes across the City to address skills and education needs;
- Enhancing regional collaboration and innovation;
