

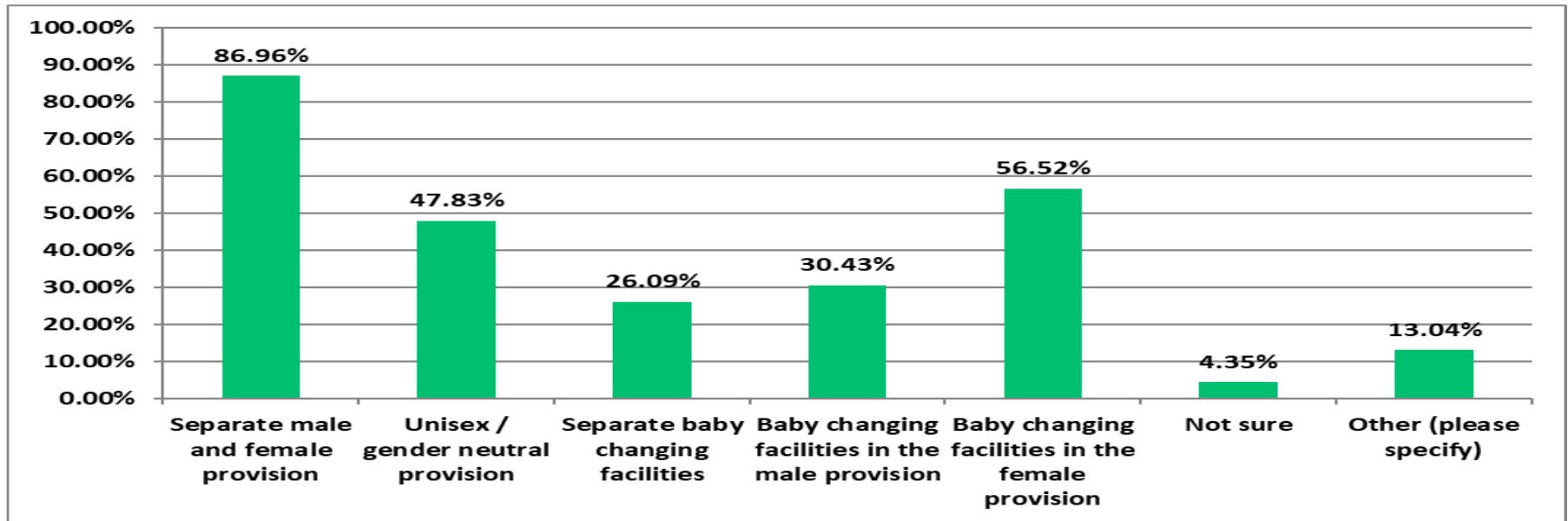

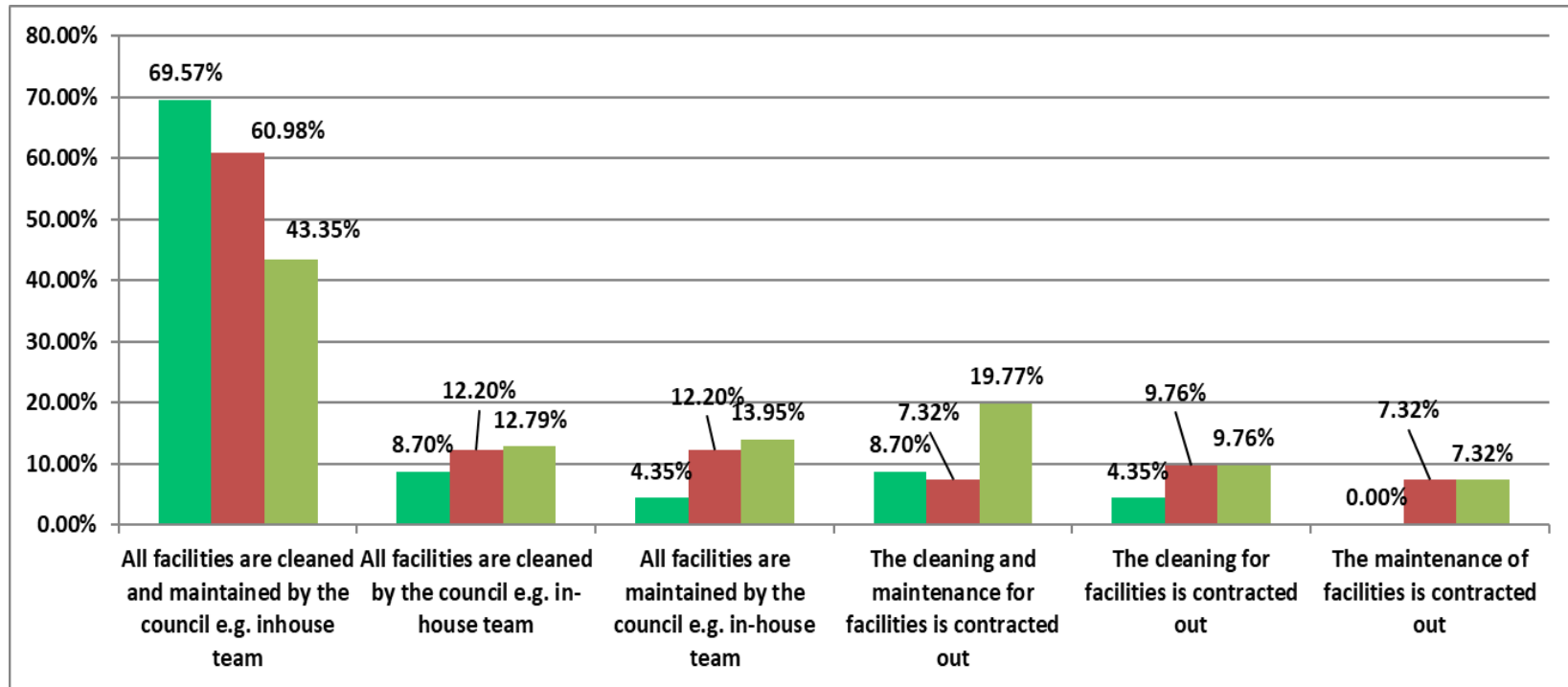

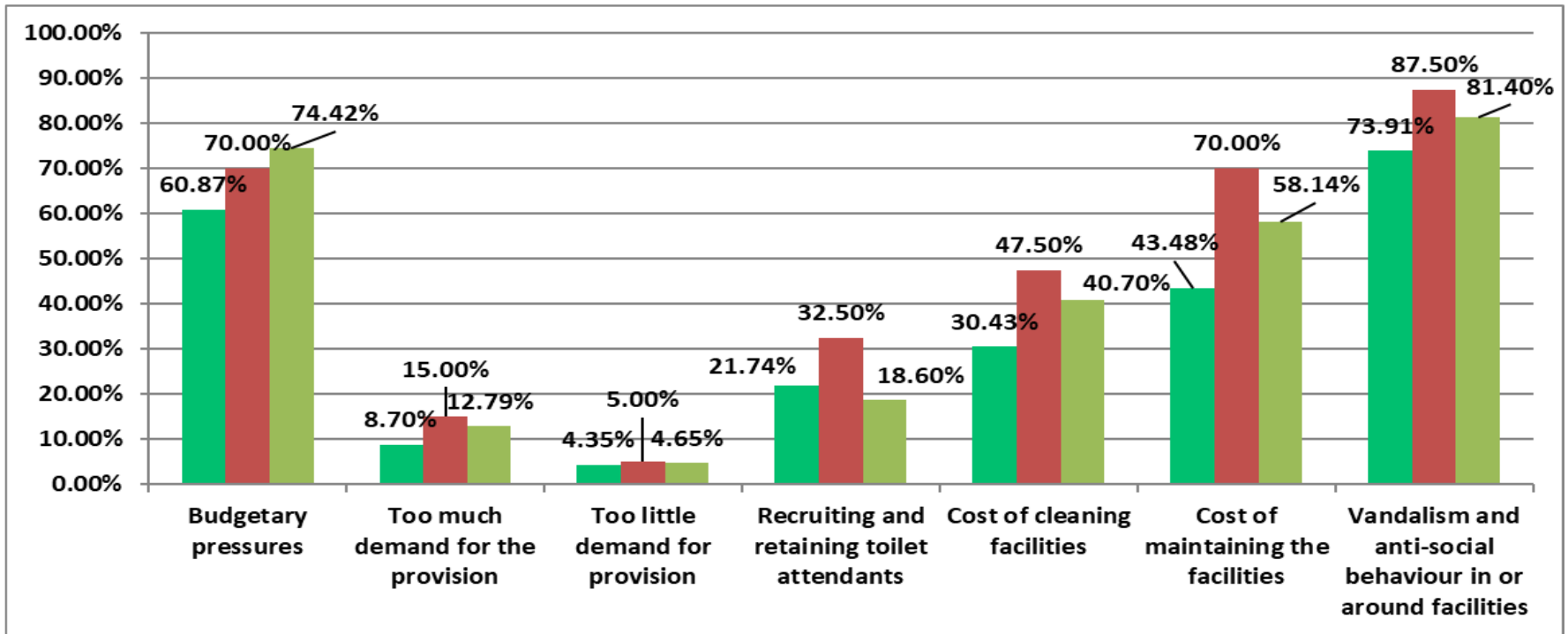
# What type of permanent provision does your authority provide?



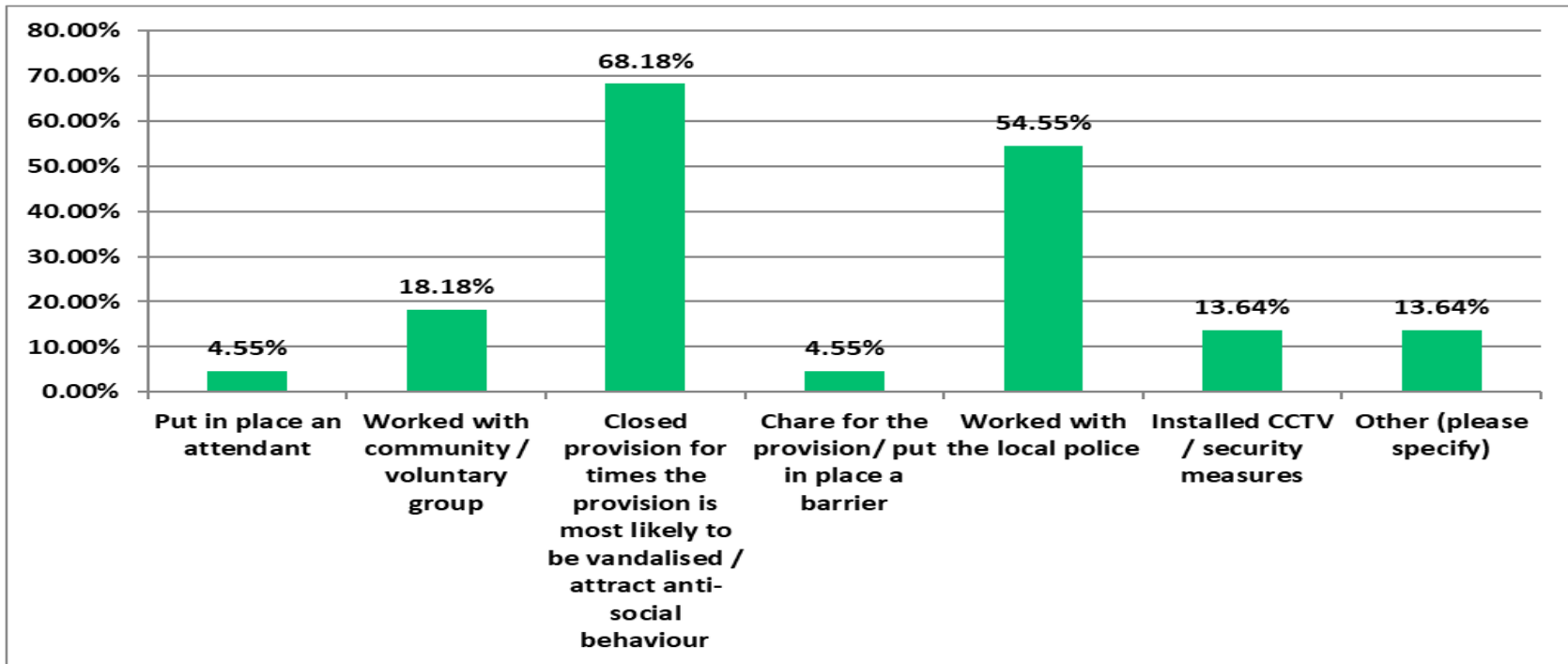
# How is the provision maintained and cleaned?



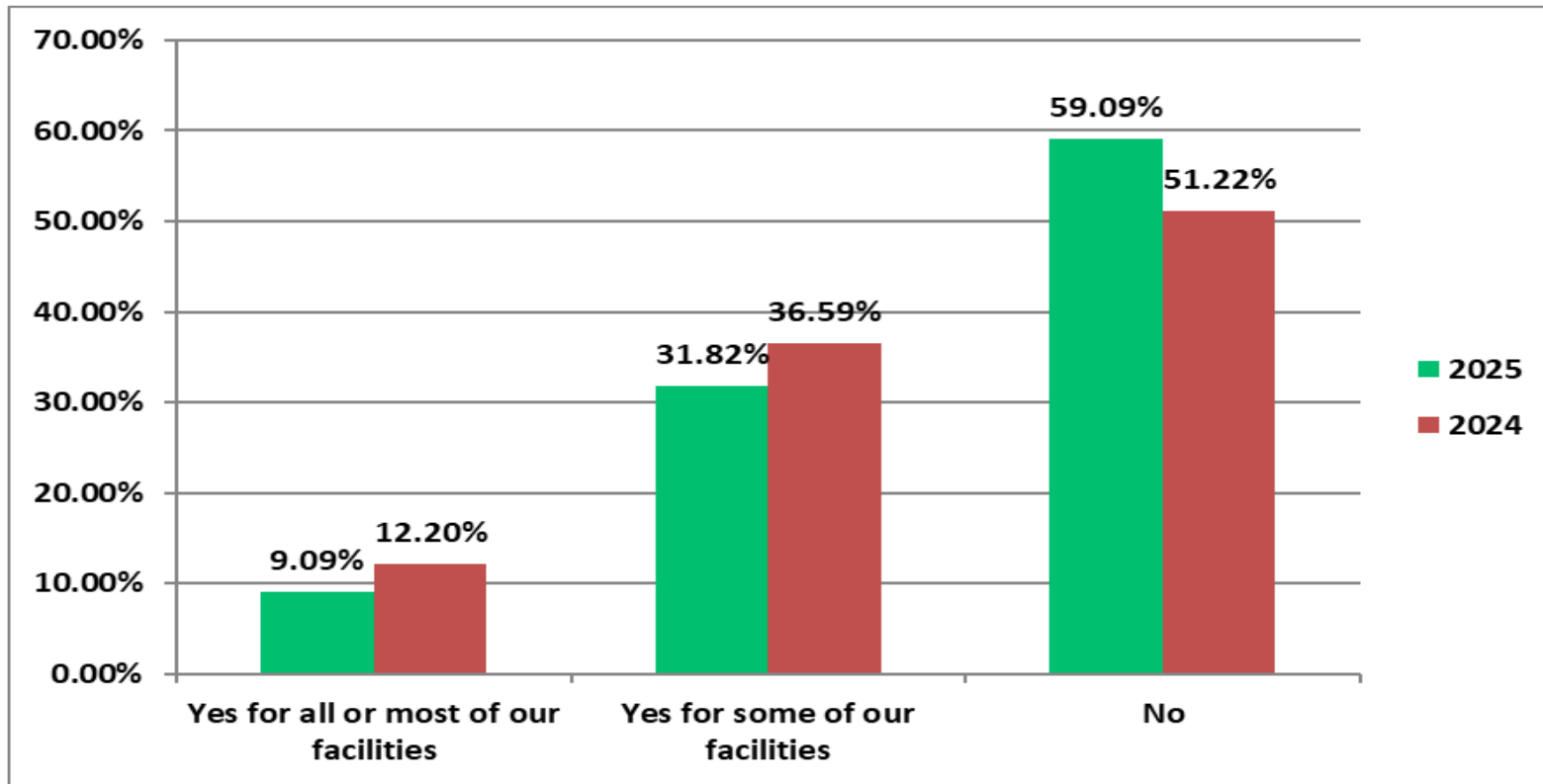
# What are the greatest challenges in providing public toilet facilities?



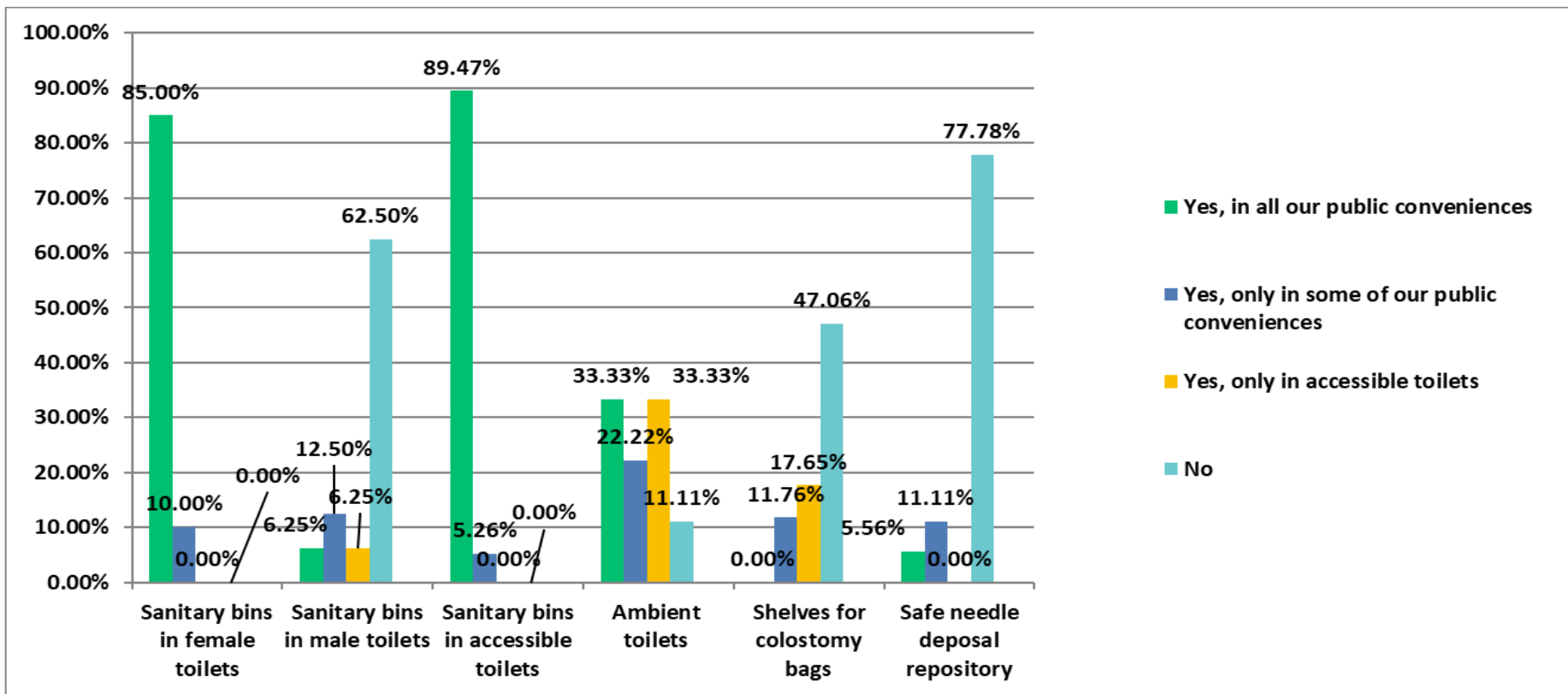
# What measures has the council put in place to mitigate the impact from vandalism / anti-social behaviour?



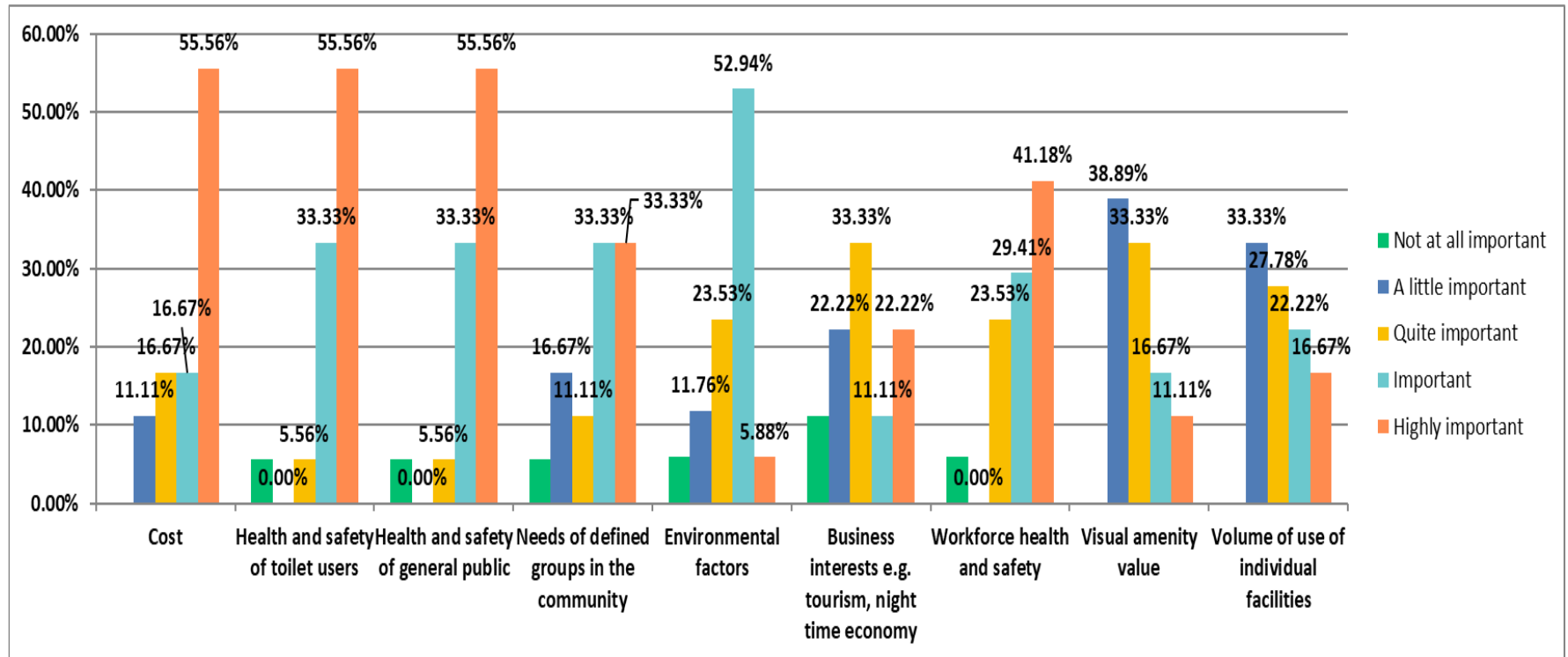

# Do your public conveniences include any of the following provisions?

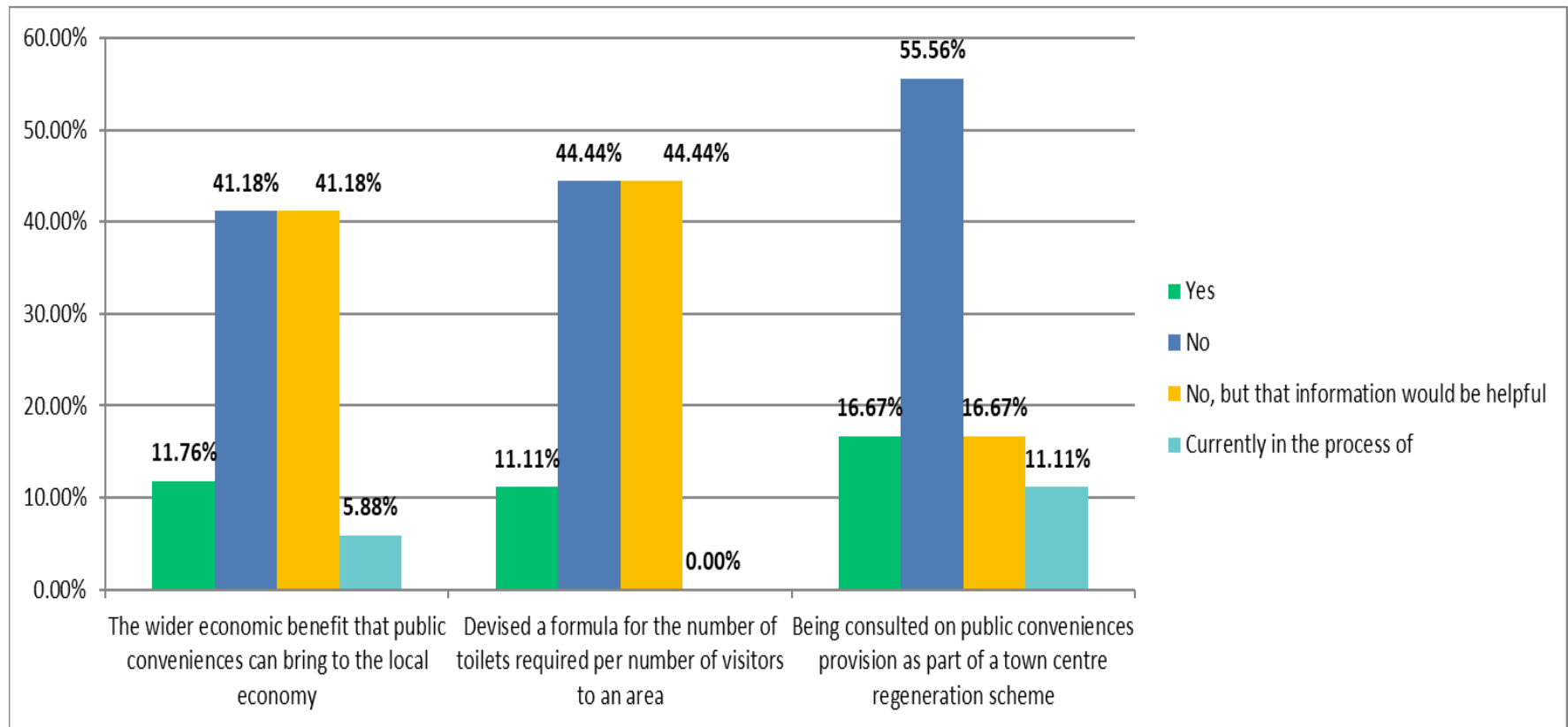

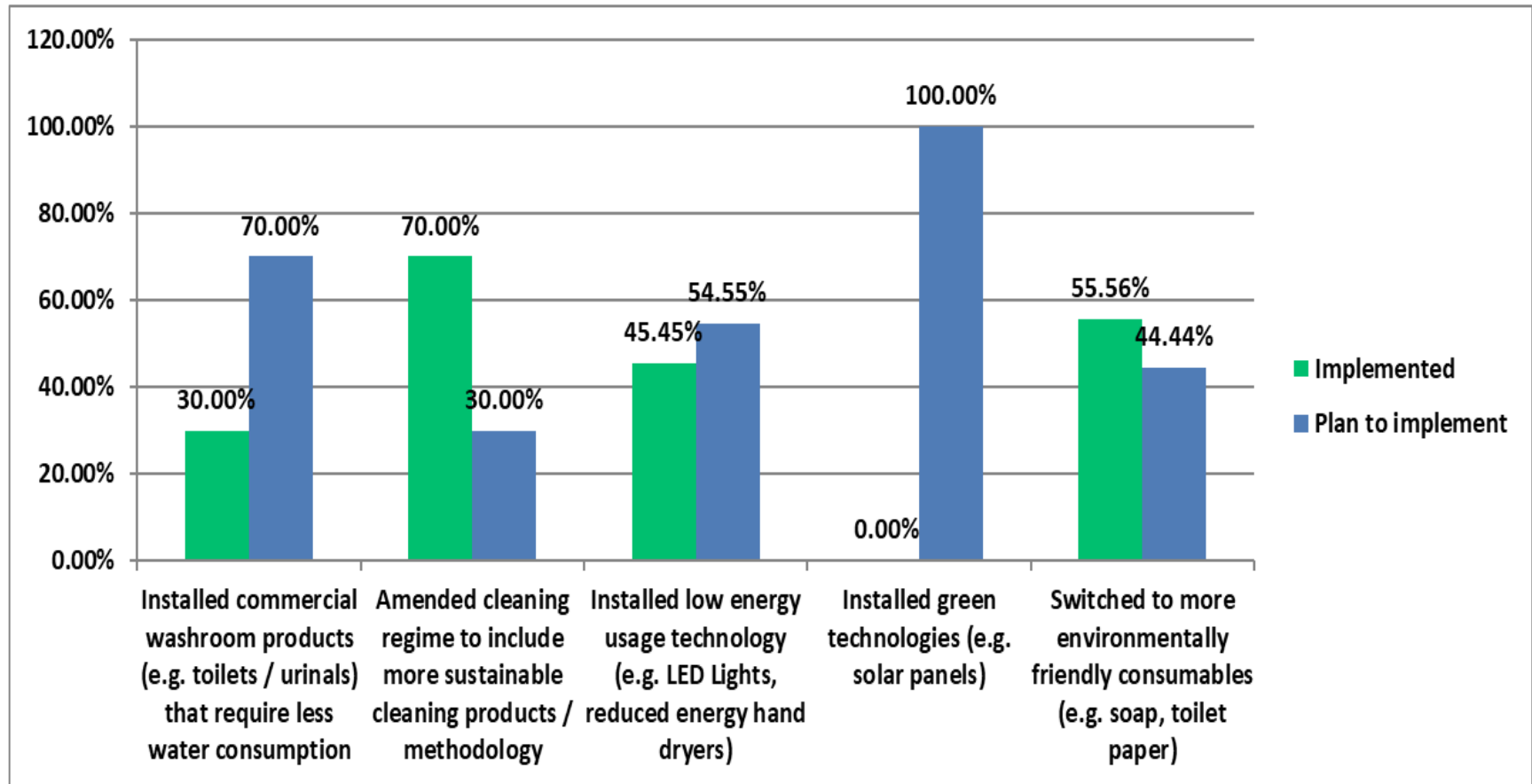
