In 2019 it's a very mixed picture across local government and we are at a pivotal moment in the future of our nations green spaces.







# Volume of resources by authority type on average down by 26% since 2010



#### Real net spending by authority type on average down by 32% since 2010



The "average" hides bigger cuts in some authorities.

Some authorities budgets have remained stable

Town or Parish Councils are relatively unaffected

The direction is still downwards

Austerity is not over

Total spending on parks and open spaces in England for 2014/15 was 972 million pounds

Total spending on parks and green spaces in England for 2016/17 was 630 million pounds

A loss of 342 million pounds

#### Lets start with the basics, caveats and warnings....

There is no silver bullet
Every authority is different
What works for one may not work for another
Public and political opposition
Capital and revenue funding are very different
Inequality and barriers to use
You still need staff

Local Authorities still have a combined spending power of over 44 billion pounds. Parks & Green spaces account for approx. 1% of this spend.

Should we be asking ourselves a different question?




