"Media and popular culture bombards us with the belief that native animal biodiversity can only be supported by native plants – the scientific literature is increasingly suggesting that this is far from true"




A Massive Decline in all Pollinators



UK: 250 species of bees and 2,200 butterflies and moths









Pollinator Pressures

- Pests and diseases
- Extreme weather and climate change
- Invasive species competition
- Pesticide armageddon
- The Biggy.....Habitat Loss!







In Western Europe vegetable allotments are better for pollinator diversity and density than native wildflower meadows in a nature reserve!





The Challenges

Trying to establish you own 'natural' meadow comes with a number of challenges...



Can take many, many years



Needs specific conditions (e.g. infertile soils)



Still weedy intervention; highly complex communities



Short flowering season



We're not all Prince Charles!

Many meadows fail due to lack of knowledge/expertise...





The Designed Meadows concept began with research led by Prof. Nigel Dunnett at the University of Sheffield over 20 years ago.

The aim: to create 'meadow-like landscapes'.







Designed Meadows

Designed meadows differ from natural meadows in a number of ways...



Utilise 'borrowed wildflowers from around the world (we have only 1,000 species in the UK!)



Much more visually impactful



Increased biodiversity



Bring nature to urban dwellers
