Context

- 2019 rough sleeper estimate:
 - England: 4,266
 - Ashfield: 5
 - Nottinghamshire: 36
- Everyone In placements:
 - England: 15,000
 - Ashfield: 20 temporary and 30 permanent
- Target to end rough sleeping:
 - 2018: 2027
 - 2019: 2025
 - 2020: 29th March 2020

Context

- Rough sleeping funding:
 - 2018: £100m
 - January 2020: £112m
 - March 2020: £237m + £144m + £262m
 - May 2020: £433m
 - June 2020: £105m

Everyone In - Ashfield

- Rough sleeper estimate: 5
- Temporary accommodation placements: 20
- Permanent housing secured: 30
- 2019/20 street outreach cases: 33
- 2019/20 RSI service cases: 200
- 2019/20 new rough sleeping cases in Nottinghamshire: 175

Everyone In - Ashfield

- Winter shelter closed
- Extra temporary accommodation
- Out of area B&Bs
- YMCA opened
- Landlord Liaison Officer
- Staff levels maintained
- Local Resilience Forum housing sub group
- Testing and isolation procedures
- Case study
