






Some strategic issues and challenges

- Austerity (funding down)
- Ageing Population (demands up)
- Climate Change/Environmental Protection (decarbonisation/air quality/biodiversity)
- Sustainable Resource Use (waste/green growth/circular economy)



Increased service integration through INSOURCING of revenue activity to help address austerity


Provides more flexibility and control required to deliver savings and maintain sustainability

- Insourced its Civic Buildings Maintenance activity
- Insourced its Leisure Facilities Maintenance activity (partnering with our Leisure Trust)
- Started insourcing its waste management contract (and winding up the LAWDaC)



Ageing population & workforce



Workforce age profile will drive increasing partnering, shared working and resource/expertise sharing



Austerity & Ageing Population

More service integration towards demand management

West of England Strategic Place Director – "main focus of Environmental Services is now to help manage demand in Adult Services"

And we can add to that other needs, for example:

to help manage demand for travel and encourage Active Travel





Managing Demand - NPT/MWWFRS Culvert Partnership



Will see more direct service activity directed to helping people stay in their homes and promoting Active travel

- Highway gritting + access improvements, property adaptions + 'Handy Van' property services)
- Working with WG/NRW/Fire & Rescue Services to tackle flooding and adverse weather impacts
- Work to tackle Env. Health events which like flooding can have a disproportionate effect on older people
- Gritting/access imps to rail/bus stations working with TfW



Climate Change/Environmental Protection

Direct Services will be making a contribution to carbon reduction through transport and equipment

Some LAs already partner with farmers for severe weather response re: road salting/snow clearance


Is weed/overgrowth control next?



Austerity – Doing with Less

- Integrating Direct Services & flexible working to reduce cost/increase resilience (e.g. NPT pest control/mgt stray dogs/enforcement)
- More LA partnering with 3rd Sector/Friends Groups etc.
- Community Asset Transfers

In Summary

<u>There will be some cuts to Direct Services but partnership</u> <u>working and service integration will help</u>

[Non-statutory especially vulnerable, for example pest control, but could we see WG intervention?]

Less Direct Service activity in environmental maintenance but no-one wants to live in a dump
