Who are we?

We are a Welsh Government sponsored initiative, coordinated by Natural Resources Wales. We bring together over 50 partners including the 22 Local Authorities in Wales, Keep Wales Tidy, Third Sector Organisations, Private Landowners, Community Groups and the Police and Fire Services.





About Us

It is generally agreed that to tackle fly-tipping, behavioural change is needed through education, enforcement and community engagement.


We use a **preventative approach** to reducing fly-tipping and develop collaborative and innovative solutions with partners that draw upon the 3 E's above.





Fly-tipping Strategy

Our main focus is to work in partnership to deliver the actions within 'A Fly-tipping Free Wales' - Welsh Government's fly-tipping strategy





Strategy Outcomes



Outcome 1 - All key organisations in Wales commit to eliminating flytipping - a commitment that is embedded in their strategies and day to day operations.

Outcome 2 - Fly-tipping is widely understood as being socially unacceptable

Outcome 3 - It becomes easier for people to deal with their waste responsibly

Outcome 4 – Anyone who fly-tips is caught and punished appropriately.





Communicating with Partners

We hold three working group meetings, twice a year:

- Fly-tipping on private land
- Making fly-tipping socially unacceptable
- Enforcement

The **knowledge hub** is a digital collaboration platform for public service. We have set up on-line forums to allow partners to share best practice and request advice.





Social Marketing

We have developed a bi-lingual communications toolkit for our partners to utilise - helping to get consistent messaging out to members of the public.






Awareness of Waste Duty of Care



Data collection - a robust evidence base is needed that covers both public and private land.


Partnership working - no one organisation can tackle fly-tipping in isolation, we need to work together.

Why is consistent data on fly-tipping important?



- Data used to publish national and LA figures
- Used for monitoring purposes (over time and by area)
- Wide press interest & coverage
- Evidence need for resources and investment in teams
- Monitoring policy changes



Limitations of this data




- Not all incidents are reported
- Incidents on private land often not included (including housing associations)
- Figures influenced by changes in:
 - Recording practices
 - Staffing levels and changes
 - Interpretation of guidance




Waste Data Flow Data (Previously Flycapture)














Total Number of Incidents in Wales








Improving National Data



- Produced a 'Best Practice Guide' for 'Waste Data Flow' to improve consistency of reporting
- WDF workshop was held in 2018
- Helping to validate national data submitted by LAs
- Developing FlyMapper to enable incidents to be recorded spatially and accurately in the field










A web based tool for the field recording of fly-tipping incidents.

FlyMapper has two components:

- a mobile application to record the location of incidents along with a photo
- a website where the data can be analysed in more detail.







Who is it for?

FlyMapper has been developed as a practitioners tool for the recording and management of substantiated fly-tipping incidents and is **not currently a public reporting tool.**


FlyMapper is licenced for use by all LAs and Private Organisations in Wales free of charge.





Benefits of FlyMapper





- RIPA applications
- Faster evidence retrieval / investigations
- Crime analysis using consistent data
- Reduced paperwork for LA officers and office staff
- Faster response to freedom of Information requests
- Running reports on electoral wards areas
- Monitoring policy changes
- Improved collaboration with wider organisations





Images on FlyMapper can be analysed to ensure that officers are recording waste issues using a **consistent** approach.








Side waste issues captured via FlyMapper
