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New Indicators for Street Cleansing



Environmental Protection Act 1990:

Code of Practice on Litter & Refuse,

“ The Code has two key principles:

- Areas which are habitually more heavily trafficked should have accumulations of litter cleared away more quickly than less heavily trafficked areas; and
- Larger accumulations of litter and refuse should be cleared more quickly than smaller accumulations. “



Environmental Protection Act 1990:

General Zones

- Category 1 Zone – town centres, shopping streets, major transport centres
- Category 2 Zone – high density residential areas
- Category 3 Zone – low density residential areas



New Indicators for Street Cleansing

LEAMS is the Statutory Performance Indicator

- Do we need other/new indicators?
- Does it provide an accurate reflection of standards?
- Weaknesses in current monitoring methodology?
- Currently subject to review – opportunity to update and improve?
- SOLACE – move towards focused PI's



New Indicators for Street Cleansing

APSE Quality Indicator (Scotland only)

- Also considers LEAMS index but within a wider context
 - Public perception
 - Frequencies
 - Response times/SLA's
