Spending Review

- £39 Billion for new homes (AHP)
- 10 year rent settlement (CPI+1%)
- Consultation on rent convergence,
- Full funding for the Warm Homes Plan
- Equal access for building safety remediation funding.



Renters Rights Bill

- End of Assured Shorthold + no fault eviction
- Rent Review Tribunal
- Decent Homes Standard + Awaab's law
- New Private Rented Sector Landlord Ombudsman



Devolution

- Mayoral Strategic Authorities – universal coverage
- Integrated Financial Settlements
- New Powers and Funding over
 - Skills & Employment
 - Housing
