About the Seminar

Local Government is in one of the most challenging periods in a generation. Revenue hasn't kept pace with inflation and in an increasingly competitive jobs market, is failing to compete with other public sector organisations and the NHS.

In the technical disciplines, like vehicle maintenance and highways, years of national focus on University education has dramatically reduced the number of apprenticeships, especially within the private sector. We are now seeing a perfect storm as older workers move into retirement and attracting new staff has reached breaking point.

This Summit, brings together those involved in delivering front-line services, often those that require boots on the ground – you simply can't empty the bins or cut the grass whilst home working or contract it to an internet based consultant.

We will chart the challenges and make suggestions for how local government will adapt to continue to deliver statutory services and protect the non-statutory services like parks and leisure facilities.
