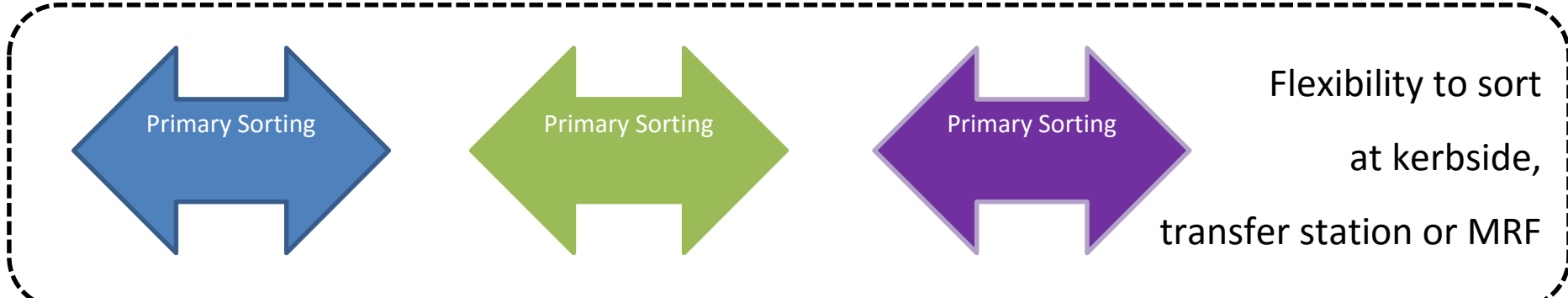
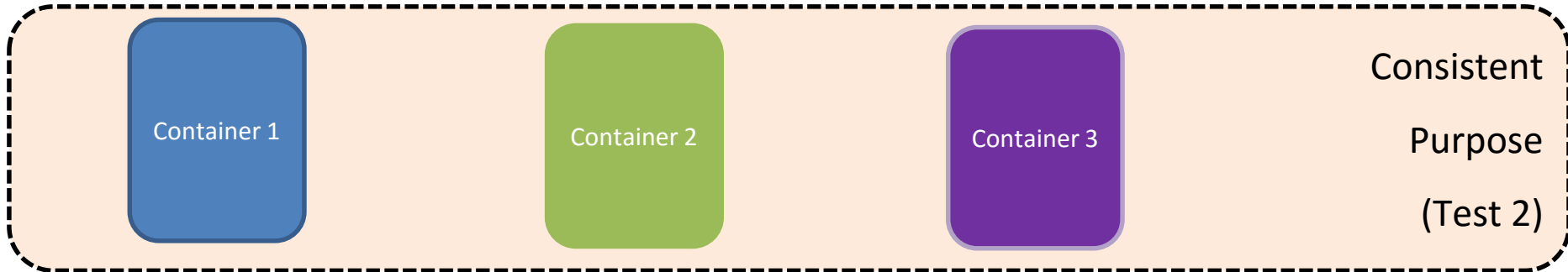
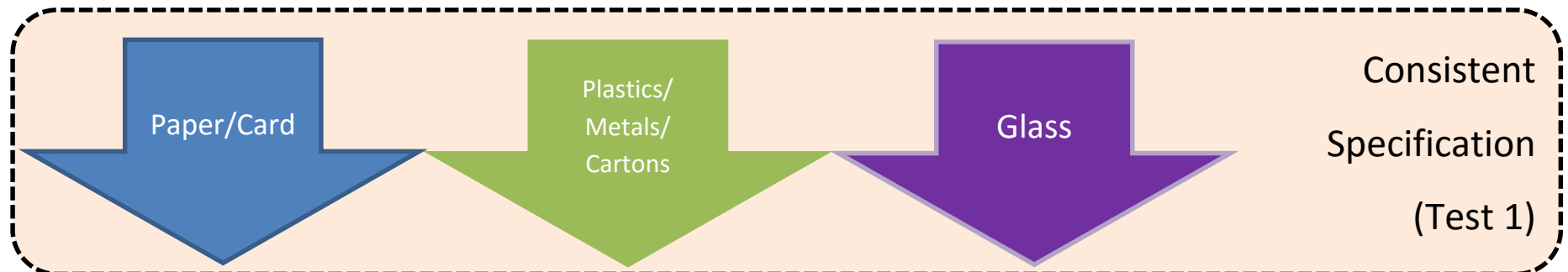

What is the Household Recycling Charter?



- Zero Waste Taskforce formed between March 2014 and June 2015.
- Recommended the development of a Household Recycling Charter to deliver greater consistency.
- Charter sets out 21 principles and refers to the Code of Practice
- CoP has 4 main chapters
 - Design; Policies; Operations; Communication.
- Councils invited to consider signing the charter Feb 2016
- Whole process is voluntary



Summary of CoP

- 2 containers at kerbside
 - Paper/Card
 - Metals, Plastics & Cartons
- 1 container at kerbside or recycling points
 - Glass
- Sorting can occur at 3 stages
 - Kerbside
 - Transfer station
 - MRF
- Food collected from urban areas (as now)
- Glass can be colour separated by citizens/collectors/sorting facility
 - All required to meet benchmark standard

Signatories



- 17 Councils have signed the Charter

 - Highland

 - Scottish Borders
 - South Lanarkshire
 - Western Isles
- Support available to assist signing



Current Work

- Profiling implementation to align requirements
- Options Appraisals
 - Two complete
 - Five ongoing
- LA produce transitions plan to submit for consideration
 - Capital funding
 - Three panels per year
 - Evaluation
- Offer in Principle
- Strategic & Advisory Groups

Transition Plan Evaluation

- Number of factors to assess transition plans against
- Importance of criteria will vary depending on local circumstances
 - Nature of service change required
 - Selected collection scenario
 - Sustainability of the proposed service
 - Payback period
 - Deliverability
 - Material quality
 - Transparency of model
 - Any linked service changes



Summary

- Charter launched in February, 17 signatories;
- Support is available to assist signing the Charter;
- Governance process is now in place
 - Advisory Group
 - Strategic Group
