

- Practical tools for measuring and maximising the potential of local authority assets



Research Recently Completed (2)

Innovation on the frontline

- Based on research in partnership with APSE & IPPR (Institute for Public Policy Research) North
- Exploring ways LA's can harness the best ideas of their workforce in order to use innovation to improve services
- It explores positive ways in which LA's can respond to austerity
- Two principles within report
 - Innovation not exclusive to private sector
 - Frontline employees have intimate knowledge that can help make services as effective as possible
