### There was a buge improvement after the pilot to the road, however there have been recent problems in terms of bulky items, overflowing bins and bagged side waste. Whilst these issues are being addressed, any reoccurrence can attract more waste and make your road look messy. Inforcement action will be taken, such as the recent issue of a fixed penalty notice (FPN) for flytipping on the road.

# Evaluation



### Key findings:

- Surveys issued to residents
- Attendance at roadshows was low, greater success with door to door engagement
- Rapid response lines pre intervention 49
- Post campaign only 12 rapid response requests
- Only 5 reports for flytipping
