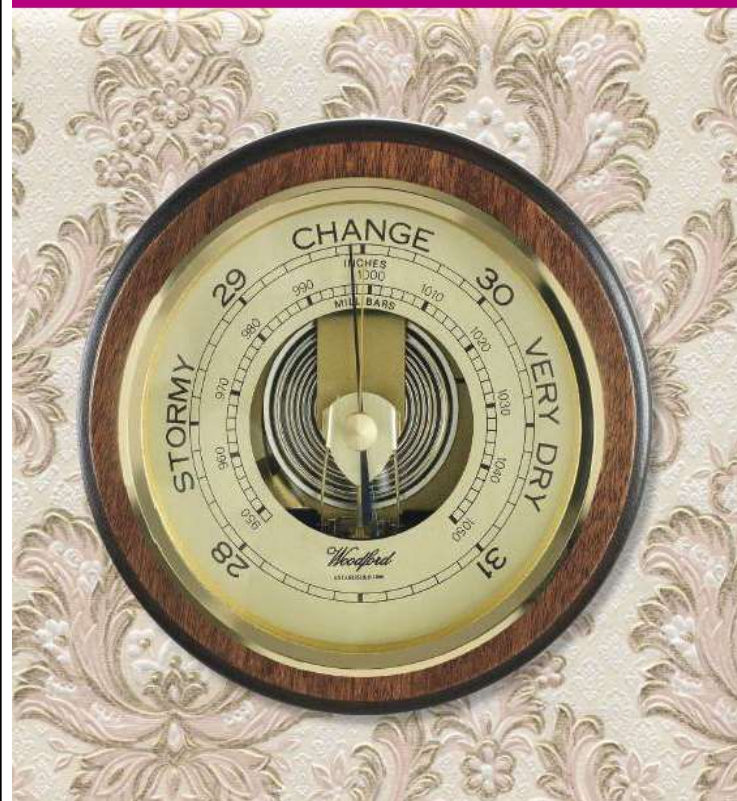
## Sustainable local government finance and liveable local areas – Can we survive to 2020?

By 2020, the combined current and capital spending by UK local government will be lower than at any time since before 1948, finds new research from APSE and New Policy Institute. The report reveals that many of the things which local authorities in the UK have taken for granted for decades will be gone by 2020. The research found that whilst recent settlements mean the more deprived authorities will not see significant further decreases in funding by 2020, a new dimension of inequality is opening up according to how strongly an authority can grow its business rate income.

## The engine of the council? Evaluating frontline productivity in local government

In a research collaboration between Public Intelligence and APSE, this report explores the ways in which frontline services in UK local government have increased productivity in recent years. This research looks at how local government managers have managed to increase productivity to help struggling services, rather than just reduce service provision. This report builds on the unique insights provided by APSE Performance Networks data, and combines this data with original case study research to explore how frontline services across the UK are facing up to the productivity challenge.

This research looks at **APSE's** Ensuring Council model through the prism of workforce planning.

Ultimately, this report argues that effective workforce planning can help to future-proof public service delivery by opening up a collective dialogue about the future shape and scope of public service, and the role of local employees and communities. It can improve the flexibility and resilience of local authority responses to the changing demands of communities and local businesses, as well as ensuring that support is provided at times of crisis or emergency.
