

Retail energy policies in Britain: Towards 2020 – Free Report

The policy issue of retail domestic energy in the UK has taken on a very high media profile over the past few years. A number of separate, but related issues have coalesced into making domestic energy bills a front line political agenda item. The legislative needs of agreed CO2 emission reductions, when combined with domestic housing stock conditions has meant keeping homes warm is not a cheap option. Yet whilst domestic energy usage has fallen by over 6% average dual fuel domestic energy bills have risen by over 70% in under a decade. This free to download publication explores the political, policy and practical implications of retail energy pricing.





The future of elected members in Scotland – Free Report

changing demands, requirements and The expectations of the office of the councillor, like those of local government, are once again under scrutiny in Scotland. This 2014 study 'The future role of elected members in Scotland' surveys the beliefs and attitudes of elected members across Scotland. Analysis of the survey raises four primary issues for local politics and policy in Scotland: the constant question of representation; harnessing the community patch orientation of councillors; boosting external-facing roles and functions; and the difference of outlook between executive and non-executive councillors. It concludes with an assessment of how these lessons might inform current debates over the future of local government in Scotland.
