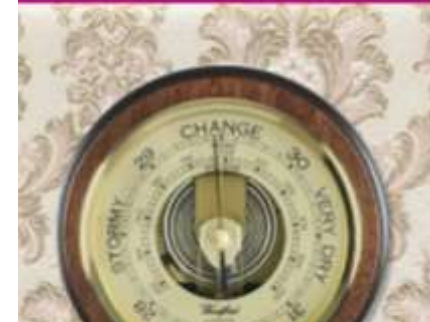

Councils have already started to develop their own innovative responses to the challenge of employability. However, as the Work and Health Programme comes into operation, there is a danger of missed opportunities, and councils could offer much more if given the tools and incentives to do so. In fact, with the right support, local authorities could start to form the new frontline for employability support in a way that is far more efficient and locally-sensitive than national programmes. This collaborative report from APSE and NLGN scrutinises the current place of local authorities in tackling unemployment.

- ▶ PI57a – Total cost per kilometre of carriageway travelled for precautionary treatment (SCOTS)
- ▶ PI57b – Total cost per kilometre of carriageway treated for precautionary salting (SCCW)
- ▶ PI58 – Total cost per kilometre of footway travelled for precautionary treatment
- ▶ PI300 - % of principal inspections carried out on time
- ▶ PI302 – Bridge stock indicator – average BSCLav

## Current List for Street Lighting

- ▶ PI01b – Average cost of maintaining street lights excluding bulk/ capital replacement
- ▶ PI02a - % of street lamps not working as planned
- ▶ PI03 - % of lamps restored to working condition within 7 days
- ▶ PI04 – Average time to repair lamps (authority only)
- ▶ PI18b – Average annual electricity consumption per street light (KWH)
- ▶ PI29b – Mean time between failures (MTBF) in years
- ▶ PI38a - % of street lamps that are dimmable or part night lighting
