



Work it out: Creating Local Systems of Employability Support

Councils have already started to develop their own innovative responses to the challenge of employability. However, as the Work and Health Programme comes into operation, there is a danger of missed opportunities, and councils could offer much more if given the tools and incentives to do so. In fact, with the right support, local authorities could start to form the new frontline for employability support in a way that is far more efficient and locallysensitive than national programmes. This from collaborative report APSE and NLGN scrutinises the current place of local authorities in tackling unemployment.

- PI18b Average annual electricity consumption per street light (KWH)
- ▶ PI29b Mean time between failures (MTBF) in years
- PI38a % of street lamps that are dimmable or part night lighting
