




Current Challenges: Capital Maintenance Budget

Current Challenges: Staff Recruitment / Retention

- Construction industry upturn:
 - High private sector wages
 - Lack of resource LA staff in high demand
- Long term local authority wage restraint
- Equal Pay Profit related pay schemes ??? No longer available
- Restricted training budgets for future development

Current Challenges: Member/Public Expectation

 Lack of public appreciation of funding issues and effect on resources available

Some lack of strategic thinking at Member level :

"Never mind the Authority wide issues I want my problem solved ... now!

Allocated Capital Funding

- Local Highways Maintenance Funding Needs Element Formula funded (£ 725 million)
- Local Highways Maintenance Incentive/Efficiency Element Funding (£ 150 million)
- Pothole Action Fund (£50 million)
- Local Highways Maintenance Funding (£ 420 million)

Funding Available Through Bidding Process

National Roads Fund
(£28.8 Billion)

National Productivity Investment Fund (NPIF) (£150 Million)

• Local Growth Fund (£6.7 Million)

Developing Solutions:

- In-sourcing services ?
- Addition central government funding (£420 million in 2018/19)
- Capitalisation of activities traditionally classed as Capital?
- Many Authorities investing in capital programmes.. but is it enough?

Long Term Plan

- DfT Investment programme that meets backlog (Select Committee currently examining)
- Allow Capital funding to be directed to revenue budget activities
- Less bidding for available funding ..resource hungry with no guarantee of success
- Loosen restraint on Local Authority wages to aid recruitment/retention
