



Developing action plan and finding finance

- One project 2 phases
- Set realistic timescales
- Frank discussion around expectations
- What's the future plan?

- Clear project plan
- Take the lead
- Be bold and cheeky when looking for funding
- Don't overlook the generosity of the public

Phase 1 The Fire Damaged Chapel



- Define Outcome
- Timescale
- Find innovative ways of finding finance
- Don't overlook generosity of public
- Quicker win project with relatively low cost (35k)
