

What is Peatland ACTION?

A national programme to restore peatlands across Scotland

Led by Scottish Government team, delivered in partnership with:

- NatureScot and partner organisations Shetland Amenity Trust, Carloway Estate Trust; Lochaber Fisheries Trust, Argyll Countryside Trust, Glasgow Clyde Valley Green Network, Crichton Carbon Centre and the Tweed Forum;
- Forestry & Land Scotland
- National Park Authorities (Cairngorms and Loch Lomond & Trossachs)





Why?


- Current state of our peatlands

Peatland restoration in Scotland – Targets!

Government commitment – £250M to restore 250,000 hectares by 2030





What we do/can pay for ...

- Guidance and support where and how to restore
- Feasibility study/Peat depth/Species survey
- Project design including support with Construction Design and Management regulations and other consents
- Tendering process
- Full cost of capital works
- Project management






What have we achieved so far?

- 445 restoration projects;
 green dots
- 172 feasibility projects;
 amber dots
- 42,000 ha 'on the road to recovery', and counting.
- But we need to do much more...





What more are we doing to increase pace and scale?

- Multi-year funding agreements
- More Peatland ACTION project officers
- Roll out of the Project Development Support Scheme
- Bird Breeding protocol guidance published to extend the season
- Technical Compendium available online
- Gathering of more evidence to demonstrate benefits
- More communications work to increase awareness and encourage more uptake.
- Training for contractors and designers.
- Aligning with Peatland Code and Permitted Development processes.

The PDR Process

- In 2020 PDR were specified for peatland restoration projects
- We must submit scheme details and a map plus the fee. Details to cover:
 - impacts of the proposed development on archaeology,
 - the risk of contamination or flooding as a result of the development on the peatland site,
 - the impacts of the proposed development on soil, and
 - the removal, felling, lopping or topping of any trees,
 - Designated site information of relevant.
