We have residents who are struggling in life and need more support than others.

One in four children live in poverty and more 5,000 people rely on foodbanks.

The weekly wage in Gateshead is well below the national average

There are parts of Gateshead where life expectancy is much shorter than in others.

Fill the Holiday Gap 2015 - 2018

- 4 years working with communities & volunteers delivering FREE holiday scheme across Gateshead
- Very little budget Lots of good will
- Community Centres Churches and Village Halls

Gateshead Holiday Activities and Food

- Department for Education Pilot project
- £204,403 secured through competitive bidding
- Free holiday clubs with a meal / lunch provided
- Targeted at disadvantaged children including FSM eligible
- Recommended model of 4 x 4 x 4

The Approach

- Project bid highlighted the FSM figures at the neighbourhood level
 - Beacon Lough East 51%
 - Sunderland Road 45%
 - Old Fold / Nest Estates 41%
- Mapping exercise to match supply with demand
- Additional capacity in the east and west of Gateshead
- 39 projects from schools, community centres to Chopwell Woods

The Venues and Groups

- Schools primary and secondary
- Community settings and groups
- Council led provision



Promotion of the Activities


- Project led -
























Results to Date

- 2,017 children attended 39 projects
 - Smallest project 10 children
 - Largest project 268 children
 - Average project 52 children
- Average of attendance for each child of 5 days
- Over 10,000 places filled



Anti Social Behaviour (ASB)

- Three of our biggest projects where in areas with higher than the gateshead average for instances of youth ASB
- 40 to 50 young people attended each day
- Police data for July and August saw a 50% reduction in youth related ASB in these three location in Gateshead

Feedback from a Project 1

- Number of foodbank referrals over the summer holidays 2
- Number of foodbank referrals in September 15
- Project worked with 77 children
- Meals cooked on site and included provision for parents
- 2 / 3 days per week of activities

Feedback from a Project 2

Parents reported that with the saving they made during the Summer Scheme on food purchases they where able to buy new school uniforms for their children

These parents had previously relies on donated school uniforms for their children
