











Our focus


The Council is now working towards developing programmes of work which will achieve the following aims:

- Increased carbon drawdown through natural and engineered climate solutions




Cornwall's current carbon footprint

Based on Cornwall's current Green House Gas inventory (2017 data year) Cornwall's current carbon footprint is 4 million tonnes Co2e (c28% were non-Co2 GHGs)




Since the last Greenhouse Gas inventory produced in 2011 (2008 data year) Cornwall's Co2e footprint has reduced by c19.5% and at the latest estimate 37% of our electricity now comes from renewables.

Putting principles into practice



The Saints Trail is designed with active travel in mind so has been given a score of 5 for the categories of air pollution and greenhouse gas emissions. Although land will be converted from green field in a few places, it is not all quality land and there is a full environmental impact assessment in place and mitigations planned to replace the biodiversity lost, in time.

Evidence from similar schemes shows substantial numbers of jobs created. There will also be educational signs along the trails to enable people to learn about the local historical features and environment. Although there is the possibility that opening up previously inaccessible areas of land to the public may make it possible to misuse the land, this is far outweighed by the huge health benefits and enjoyments of the local environment that will be gained by residents and visitors alike.


Embedding the tools for change: Workforce development







Carbon Neutral Cornwall Call to Action

Cornwall has set an ambitious target of becoming carbon neutral by 2030

Aiming for 2030, ahead of the Government's target of 2050, gives us the best chance of keeping global warning below 1.5 degrees Celsius. Which scientists tell us will avoid the worst impacts on our planet.

Becoming carbon neutral can be achieved in two ways, by reducing the amount of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases we are producing, and by capturing the carbon dioxide we do produce so that it can't enter the atmosphere.

This challenge can give us hope, not just that we can find our way through an emergency, but that we can rise to the challenge and come out the other side even better than before.

We're not starting from scratch, there are pioneers in Cornwall, demonstrating how we can change the ways we live, work and play. But there is always room for new ideas.

Cornwall Council is working towards becoming a Carbon Neutral Council; and Cornwall's response to Climate Change needs everyone to think and act differently. We need to change our options and our decisions.

The Carbon Neutral Cornwall Call to Action explains our vision for how Cornwall can become carbon neutral. We have made a good start and now we need everyone to get involved.

We want everyone to shape Cornwall's vision for reaching carbon neutrality.


