Survey

- prompt was interest in electric cremators and potentially coming together to buy as a group;
- energy a corporate issue as well as a service issue;
- 30 responses.



Questions:-

- electric cremators 2 installed, majority aiming for 2030;
- barriers to investing space, grid, confidence, finance/cost;
- asset data high numbers aware of condition, 3/4s had a survey;
- procurement almost all didn't have a plan to procure replacement cremators, 1 new crem and solar powered electric cremator;
- other decarbonisation work large number had done something - de-NOx units, reducing number of cremators in use, holding over, LED lighting, insulation upgrades.
- no decarb work



Questions:-

- emissions a number not aware or not monitoring;
- age of equipment 13% installed before 2000
- vast majority weren't clear on carbon & financial savings from new cremators;
- holding over popular but majority unable to provide figures on the impact on energy use;
- future plans green hydrogen trial;
- PSDS applicability.



A reminder of the obvious:-

- insulation, draught excluders, heating levels, fabric, windows;
- doors;
- generation roof/canopy solar;
- heat from cremators.

This issue isn't going away.



Corporate angle:-


- net zero targets

- Council's investment plan, climate action plan, service plans






