
- Solihull MBC previous contract ended 31st March 2016.

- Appetite for cross boundary working.









- How to gain the maximum interest.
- What would provide the most value.
- Understanding the market appetite for a combined service.




Procurement

- Two processes in tandem.
- However, we agreed a single lead Officer from SMBC.
- Two formal approval requirements.
- Mindful that there is more risk, more at stake, therefore greater responsibility.
- Required more flexibility, trust and communication.



The Outcome...



20 year (5+5+5+5) combined contract.

26% reduction in service cost for both authorities.

£100k saving for Coventry CC


£100k saving for Solihull MBC


