





Making Southampton a cleaner, greener, healthier and more sustainable city.



- New climate change predictions (UKCP18) were released in December 2018 indicating that there is likely to be increases in extreme weather and sea level rise.
- As a both an urban area and coastal city, Southampton is vulnerable to tidal and surface water flooding – the most recent widespread flood event occurred on 24 September 2019 due to extreme rainfall, with similar majorly disruptive events likely to occur frequently if action is not taken.


