- 2008 Presidential election
- Facebook:
 Obama had 2,379,102 supporters
 McCain had 620,359 supporters
- 380% more supporters
- Twitter, Youtube, Myspace
- Personalised email, individual Barack Obama accounts
- Fundraising and message sharing
- \$30 million raised on personal fundraising pages!

- New ways to highlight work and campaigns


Communicating with my electorate


