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

### Fire Service Engagement

- Home Fire Safety Visits by Fire Service (free!)
- Anyone can make a "referral"
- Partner agencies are encouraged to use our online referral system, CSET
- Visit includes an informal fire safety risk assessment, provision of advice and free 10 year battery operated SD

### **Risk Factors**

- Lone occupants
- Smokers
- Drugs / alcohol dependency
- Mobility issues
- Mental health issues
- Age in combination with other factors



### Fires in Common Stairs

- Was an issue for The Fire & Rescue Serevice this year
- All tenants and landlords have a responsibility
- Immediate risk
- <u>Leaflets / posters</u> available in pdf



## The common stair is your only means of escape in the event of a fire.



Have you ever thought what you would do if fire were to break out in your stair? It may not necessarily be in your flat! A fire started in a common stair could kill you and your family. Even a small bag of rubbish can create enough smoke to fill a whole stair. Items left in a common stair are often deliberately set on fire.

### **Keep it clear**

- · Get rubbish, old furniture, etc out of the building
- Make sure storage areas are kept locked

### If fire does start

- · Keep doors closed to prevent smoke filling your house
- Dial 999 and ask for the Fire and Rescue Service, giving as much information as you can








### Multi Storey Flat Inspections

- Firefighting lift operation
- Dry riser inlets & outlets
- Smoke vents or windows where fitted for smoke clearance
- Self closing fire doors / fire glazing on lobbies and protected stairs only
- Integrity of walls forming FF lobbies and stairs (no holes)





#### Common Deficiencies

#### FIRE DOORS

Damaged; Missing; Held open by wedge; Not closing onto frame or has broken hinges.

#### SELF-CLOSING DEVICE ON FIRE DOOR.

Defective, missing or requires adjustment.

#### STAIRWELLS, LOBBIES AND EXITS.

Breaches in fire resisting construction; Fire resistant glazing cracked/broken; Combustibles being stored/ obstructions present; Exits blocked; or Lighting broken/defective

#### LANDINGS.

Flat/house doors additionally secured restricting Fire Service entry e.g. iron gates; UPVC front door fitted; Combustibles being stored/ obstructions present.

#### RISER INLETS/OUTLETS.

Release mechanism faulty or no washer; Door panel broken or faulty door lock; Inlet riser door not clearly painted or denoted; Valve packing gland leaking -wet riser only; Guidance on operation of wet riser not posted/visible.

#### FIREFIGHTING LIFTS.

Controls inoperable or inaccessible; Switch faulty or lift not operating when switched; Lift keys inoperable or missing; Emergency lift recall test failure.

#### SMOKE CONTROL SYSTEMS

Mechanical /Natural. Fault showing/non-operable.

#### DOOR ENTRY CODE / ACCESS FOR APPLIANCES:-

Door entry code invalid; Access to riser inlet from hydrant not available; Suitable space/hydrant access not available; Issues with hydrant availability/condition.





### Private Rented Accommodation

- The Housing Act 2014 (repairing standard)
- All SD fitted after 3 Sept 2007 must be mains interlinked (with standby supply)
- BS 5839-6
- Weekly test
- Housing and Property Chamber
- Changes to the Law





### Licensable HMOs

- Part 3 of the Housing (Scotland) Act for licensing
- Part 3 of the <u>Fire (Scotland) Act</u> for fire safety
- Practical Fire Safety Guidance for Premises Providing <u>Sleeping Accommodation</u>
- FSRA required
- More stringent fire safety measures
