Cardiff Council Budget 2014 -15



Cardiff Council Budget Situation 2014 -15

- Budget Gap of £50m for 2014-15 (c£600k overall budget)
- Education & Skills, Supporting Vulnerable Adults and Children, and Economic Development Council priorities and protected
- Significant budget challenges for delivery of other Services
- 50% target savings (controllable budget) for some Services
- Approx 17% target savings for Environment Directorate



Needs Based Street Cleansing Service



Street Cleansing 2010 – 13 City Wide



- City wide cleansing undertaken from Lamby Way depot on east side of city
- Resources predominately work
 6.30am to 2.45pm Monday to
 Thursday, 6.30 12.30 Friday
- Shop fronts also cleansed Saturday and Sunday
- High speed routes and Service Level Agreement Work also done on weekends
- Theoretical objective to clean every street once a week



Street Cleansing 2010 – 13 City Centre



- Dedicated city centre cleansing teams
 - 24/7 Monday to Friday 3 shifts
 - 4.30am to 6pm Saturday & Sunday
 - Operation Mistletoe
 Saturday and Sunday
 nights in December
 - Additional resources deployed before/during/after major events






Street Cleansing 2010 – 13 Issues




- Unable to meet objective of cleaning every street every week
- Equal spread of resources across city didn't effectively deal with demand
- Zone 2 areas in particular suffered
- Customer requests reinforced issues in Zone 2 areas
- Community Sweepers
- Silo working



- Outer Wards Some dedicated teams but most serviced by transient teams
- More focused dedicated teams in City Centre
- Improved utilisation of vehicles
- Improved flexibility
- Shop fronts continue to be cleansed daily
- More focused weekend working
- Merged Management & Supervision of Waste Collections and Street Cleansing


Other Efficiency Improvements for Consideration






Fly-tipping Trend in Cardiff



Fly tipping incidents 2007 - 2014




Historical Approach



- Silo working
- Fly-tipped waste collected by Street Cleansing, Parks, Housing and Highways
- Varying performance levels
- In Street Cleansing:
 - 3 Teams of Two Operatives & Vehicle
 - Weekly Schedule to hot spot areas plus reactive service
 - External Contractor attends to asbestos
 - Enforcement Support

Fly tipping by Service Area 2007 - 14



Proposed Approach



- Break down silo working
- Teams to remove fly-tipping from all Council areas
- Fly-tipped waste to be segregated where possible
- Benefits:
 - Improved response times
 - Reduced resources
 - Improved opportunities for enforcement
 - Diversion from landfill
 - Reduced costs



Bulky Waste Collections



Previous Approach



- Approx. 36,000 requests per year
- Dedicated RCV used for collection of bulky waste (1am, 1pm = 10 shifts a week)
- Use of spare RCV's on less busy days – allowed vehicle to be off-hired (10 shifts a week)
- From 1st October 2013, £15 charge for up to 3 items



Collected items land filled

Proposed Approach



- Use of box vans to collect bulky items
- Bulky items to be sorted/segregated rather than automatically land filled
- Benefits:
 - Diversion of waste from landfill
 - Positive contribution to recycling targets
 - Reduced overall costs estimated £75k p.a.
