

Conwy County





- Population 116,000
- 57,000 households
- Towns Llandudno, Colwyn Bay, Conwy
- 80% of dwellings in coastal strip
- 20% mainly rural
- 27% of residents Welsh speaking



Fifteen Years Ago



- 69,802 tonnes landfilled
- 18.9% municipal recycling rate
- Weekly refuse collection
- No Kerbside recycling
- Waste collection and disposal





Six Years Ago



Weekly source segregated recycling:

Food waste / Cardboard / Plastics / Cartons / Glass / Cans / Paper

Fortnightly collections:

Residual waste and Garden waste

Waste Textiles & Small Electricals, collected via local Social Enterprise

2016 Findings...



Recycling Centres +5% visitors

- 3% drop in HRC recycling rate (80% to 77%)
- + 300 tonnes net increase in residual waste



Very few service issues following implementation the difficult period prior to change!



Side Waste (4 weekly) 0.2% of properties

Raised Lids (4 Weekly) 2.3% of properties



Nappy Collection Service oversubscribed! 3,500 registrations!

Original plan = 1 driver and van

Reality = 2 drivers, 2 vans



No significant increase in litter bin usage, household waste type fly tipping or street litter




Assisted Collections

Refuse: 1% reduction Recycling: 15% increase



- 31/10/17 Improved Recycling Task & Finish Group
 Pilot Results presented / Report to be submitted to Scrutiny
- 20/11/17 Economy & Place Overview and Scrutiny Committee
 That the Economy and Place Overview and Scrutiny
 Committee recommend Cabinet support 3 weekly refuse
 collections.
- 05/12/17 Cabinet RESOLVED-

That the status quo remains i.e. continue with the pilot (3 & 4 weekly areas) to allow Officers to relook at issues/areas of concern, test the evidence and undertake a further survey of the households in the pilot area.

- 11/01/18 Economy & Place Overview and Scrutiny Committee
 Call in of cabinet decision. That the Economy and Place
 Overview and Scrutiny Committee reaffirm their previous
 recommendation (20.11.17) and recommend that Cabinet
 support 3 weekly refuse collections, subject to an accompanied
 programme of education and engagement with the people of
 Conwy County.
- 23/01/18 Cabinet (the Big one)

 That four weekly residual bin collections be implemented throughout the county in a phased approach and be completed by the end of 2019
- 15/02/18 Improved Recycling Task & Finish Group
 4 weekly mitigations. Mitigations to start as soon as practical
 and four weekly implemented in a single phased roll out with
 consideration of a delayed start until after the summer holidays

Democracy is a process, not an event ctd...

- 26/02/18 Full Council (Special Meeting)
 - Resolved to ask cabinet to reconsider its decision in relation to 4 weekly refuse collections, until it was satisfied that all mitigation measures were in place.
- (a) That we know constructions recolled out across the County, starting in September 2018, together with a comprehensive programme of education and engagement and the specified mitigations to enable residents to recycle more and waste less.
 - (b) That Cabinet is satisfied that the proposed arrangements would meet the concerns relating to education, communication and mitigation measures raised at Council on 26 February 2018.



Mitigating solutions:

- Free bulky waste collection
- Mobile recycling centres
- Second bins
- Additional recycling capacity
- Special assistance
- Communications and education

Results (compared to fortnightly residual waste collections)








4 weekly areas are looking tidy
