Stages of a renewable energy project

Stage 1 – Pre-consented

Work at this stage of a project includes:

- Feasibility assessments
- 2. Commissioning surveys
- 3. Site location
- 4. Environmental impact studies

Stage 2 - Consented

As a project draws towards the development and construction phase, key permissions and agreements will need to be in place including:

- 1. Planning permission
- 2. Grid connection offer
- Option agreements for the site and easements for cable routes
- 4. Gas connection offer (for some technologies)
- 5. Environmental consents
- Financial support under the contracts for difference regime

Stage 3 – Operating

Once a project is fully operational, there can be considerable interest from investors as the project:

- 1. Is relatively simple, requiring little or no active role
- 2. Has committed, long-term counterparties with good credit ratings
- 3. Offers stable returns
- 4. Is compatible with investors' investment policies and requirements including broader corporate and social responsibility objectives
