


Why Do We Need to Achieve High Quality Recycling?

Progress Made – UK Fibre

- UK fibre significantly improved
- CCIC data places UK #1 quality to China Q1 2018
- OCC exceeding EN643
- Mixed papers in demand strong fibre (Amazon factor)
- European mills buying large quantities
- MRFs evolving dual stream, slowing down



Some Words of Caution

- Not all plastics are bad!
