# What is Resilience?

Resilience is the capacity of communities, institutions, businesses, and systems and towns and cities to survive, adapt, and grow, no matter what kinds of chronic stresses and acute shocks they experience

## Resilient to What?


- Shocks are typically considered single event disasters, such as fires, earthquakes, and floods.
- Stresses are factors that pressure a city on a daily or reoccurring basis, such as chronic food and water shortages, endemic violence or high unemployment. Also longer term future stresses as may come from climate change or migration and urbanisation

# What does being resilient look like?

- City resilience is about making a city better, in both good times and bad, for the benefit of all its citizens, particularly the poor and vulnerable
- with the dividend being the ability to become stronger






### APPLICATION FOR RESILIENT COMMUNITIES

A scalable platform that drives behavioural change to support greater business resilience by connecting business communities and providing the ability to store, access and share guidance and best practice through a single application. Licence cost - £20 per month per user



- A database of best practice and guidance which can be accessed by communities
- Multiple categories to cover a variety of threats that have the potential to impact a community



#### Connected

- A platform for users to share and discuss best practice and guidance
- Communities overlap to enable effective sharing of information
- Database self validated by members to grow and enhance content



## Behavioural Change

- Innovative technology designed to assist users in adopting resilient activities
- Optimised flows to allow users to easily access relevant information







#### **Monitor**

- Establish a baseline of current behaviours
- Use data to drive decision making and focus efforts
- Monitor progress to show success



# Cyber Resilience



- Cyber security now judged to be one of the four biggest risks to UK industry
- Particularly at risk banks, hospitals, retailers, universities, transportation, media, manufacturing
- Cyber attack and data theft biggest risks
- Atlanta in US March 2018 ransomware attack – more than a 3<sup>rd</sup> of applications went offline. Incident response and recovery cost over \$8M
