It's Only Cleaning





- Chemical competence
- Compatibility of product surface
- Cleaning techniques / waste / chutes
- Safe disposal
- Safe storage
- Auditing the outcomes



Education and Training





- Embedding effective hygiene is crucial for a resilient UK
- A skilled trained workforce will contribute to best practice in service delivery whilst providing reassurance to end users
- Opportunities exist
- AEB and Levy Funds



Adult Education Budget (AEB)





- Designed to support workforce development
- Local colleges and education authorities hold funding
- A range of funded opportunities exist for operators, supervisors and managers
- Access criteria may vary UK resident for 2 years
- Contact your local college or provider



Apprenticeship Position





- In recent years there was the Cleaning & Support Services Apprenticeship
- First attempt to launch a fully cleaning related apprenticeship was declined
- In 2021, the Healthcare Cleaning Apprenticeship was launched
- August 2023, the Cleaning Hygiene Operative Apprenticeship was approved
- January 2024 the launch
- The apprenticeship tariff is now proportionate to the quantity and quality of the work involved

How to Access the Opportunity





Apprenticeship Levy is 0.5% of an employer's annual pay bill (exceeding £3 million). Those not contributing may seek support via Levy gifting.

- Select a training provider, agree the delivery plan and commence the onboarding process.
- Delivery format may include a number of study mediums comprising toolbox talks, face-to-face, group sessions, blended learning, observations and assessments.
- Functional Skills (Maths and English) is a compulsory requirement preferably contextualised and embedded throughout the delivery as opposed to end-loaded.

Apprenticeship Provider Selection





Selection of apprenticeship providers should include credibility checks, cleaning credentials and industry experience. Evidence of success to substantiate provider suitability is crucial to ensure positive outcomes.

Provider location must be considered as geographical planning is a factor.

Levy Funding





"Use it or you lose it!"

Levy gifting is an option available – not widely used

End Point Assessment





- 3 months window post gateway
- Assessment 3 methods
- **Knowledge test:** 24 questions, 60 mins, invigilated, closed book, pass mark circa 16 pass/fail
- Observations with questioning: 2 hours. Questions on performance. 5 questions minimum at the end fail, pass, distinction.
- **Interview:** 30 minutes. One to one with 5 questions minimum grades fail, pass, distinction.

Top tips for a successful EPA





- Practice and prepare for all assessments
- Know the facts key policy and legislation
- Know your cleaning equipment methods and sequencing
- Ensure PPE, colour coding etc. appropriate to the task
- Know your cleaning agents and COSHH
- Dilution ratios and correct measuring equipment




Top tips for a successful EPA





- Talk your way through it
- Make your actions clear and obvious
- Don't panic remain calm
- Rectify mistakes and errors, re-do if required
- WC/bathroom is commonly assessed
- Bedrooms/waiting areas commonly assessed will vary dependent on employers' site requirements
- Assessor will guide and support



Next steps





- Talk to an approved apprenticeship training provider, make sure they are aware of the new standard and talk to them about delivering it.
- Many clients like to see cleaning service providers commit to apprenticeships – think about how your company will be able to use the new standard to meet this requirement.
- If your company does not already have a strategy for getting frontline employees onto apprenticeships, consider putting one together.
