We are the trade body for the UK highways management and maintenance industry

Formed in 2005 to promote the positive contribution that the highways management and maintenance industry makes to the nation

29 full and 9 associate members who account for approximately 80% of the highways maintenance workload undertaken in Great Britain – in excess of 400,000km of roads. DLOs have joined as a member and have a seat on the Committee

Open to joint venture membership

The industry employs around 20,000 people and the annual value of works is over





Collaboration


- The HMEP and HTMA have been working together to develop a Toolkit around Client & Provider Collaboration.

- The Toolkit acts as a 'route map' for those who wish to implement and benefit from collaboration and outlines the vision for the future









