Project Summary



- Funding from DEFRA 21/22 Air Quality Grant
- 2 year project (2022 - 2024)
- Partnership between LBH, LBN, LBTH & CoL
- Funding to **raise awareness of air pollution**, but particularly to provide information to people on **how they can reduce their exposure** to air pollution
- 3 workstreams - linked by Air Aware



Project review & evaluation

- Contracted services of **independent organisation** to help evaluate overall effectiveness of the project at raising awareness of air pollution



Baseline survey with residents:

Assess general awareness of and concern for air pollution, including as a public health issue

Focus group session with trained healthcare professionals:

To review if confidence and knowledge had improved & patients could benefit

Webtool testing with residents:

To test if use of webtool increased user awareness of air pollution and how exposure can be reduced

Air quality champions focus group:

To review if volunteers knowledge, confidence & ability to support others had improved



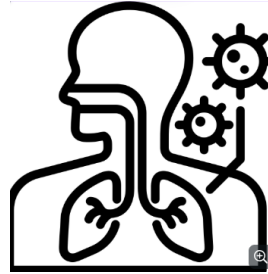

Baseline Survey



256 residents interviewed across Hackney, Newham, Tower Hamlets and City of London



4 out of 5 respondents were concerned about the impacts of air pollution on health



Survey asked people about their motivation to take action and the barriers they face



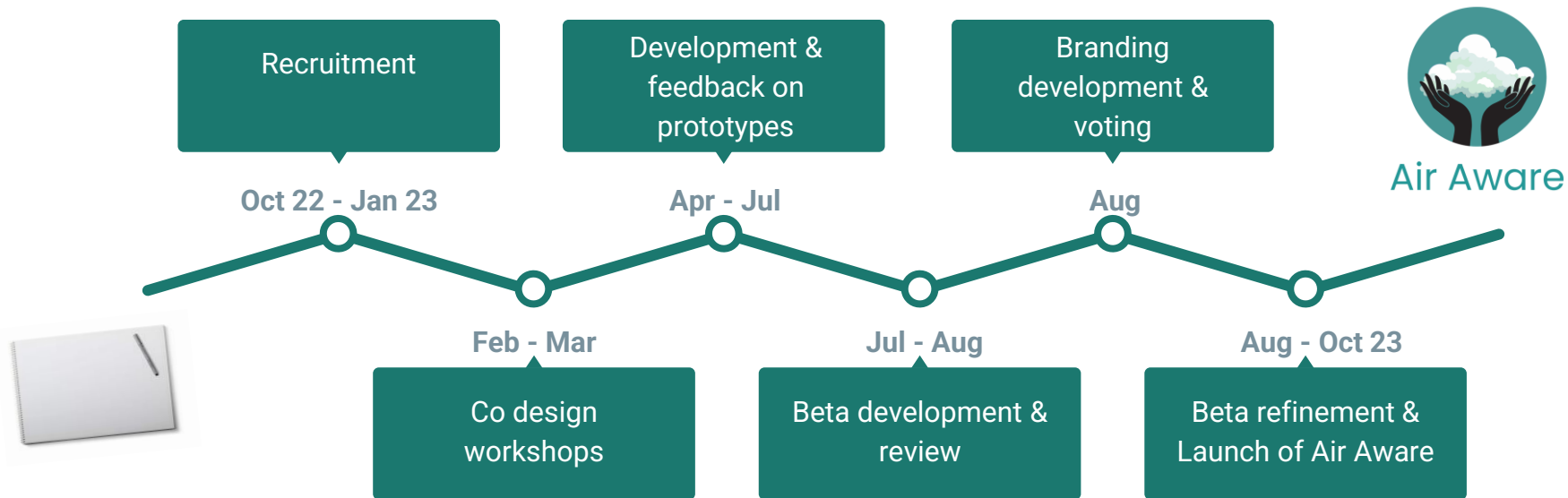
Most were not aware of pollution levels in their area

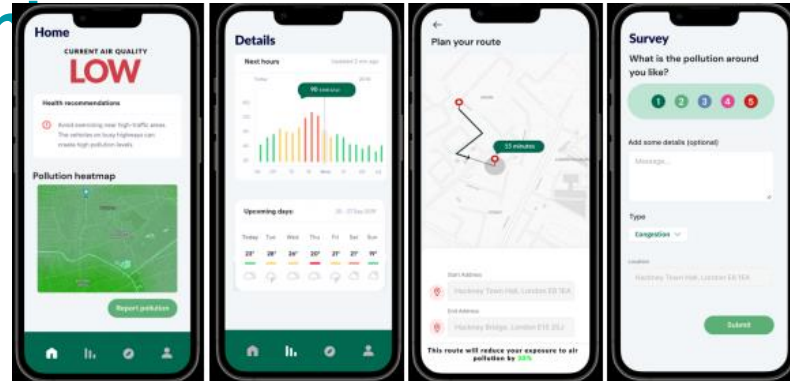

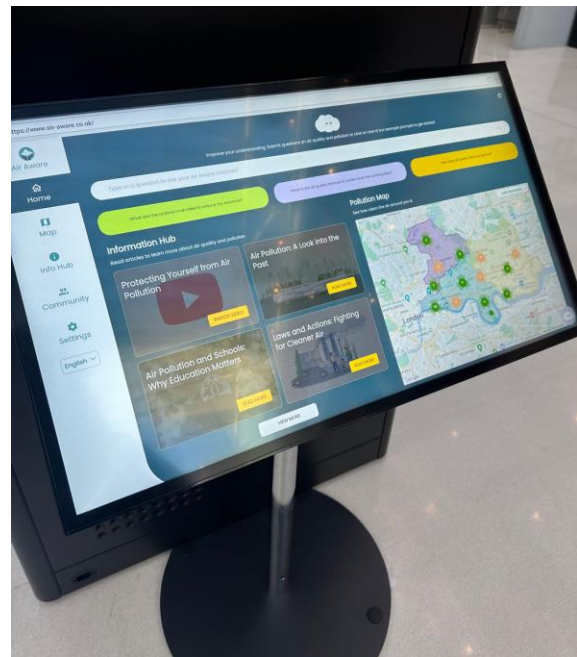

Maximising accessibility was key - to ensure access, appeal and usability for a wide audience.

- Multiple **screens** in **public areas**
- Text to speech & speech to text features
- Available in 17 of the most **commonly spoken languages** of project area
- Simple **font size** and **colour blind mode** adjustment
- Handy **user guide** on each page

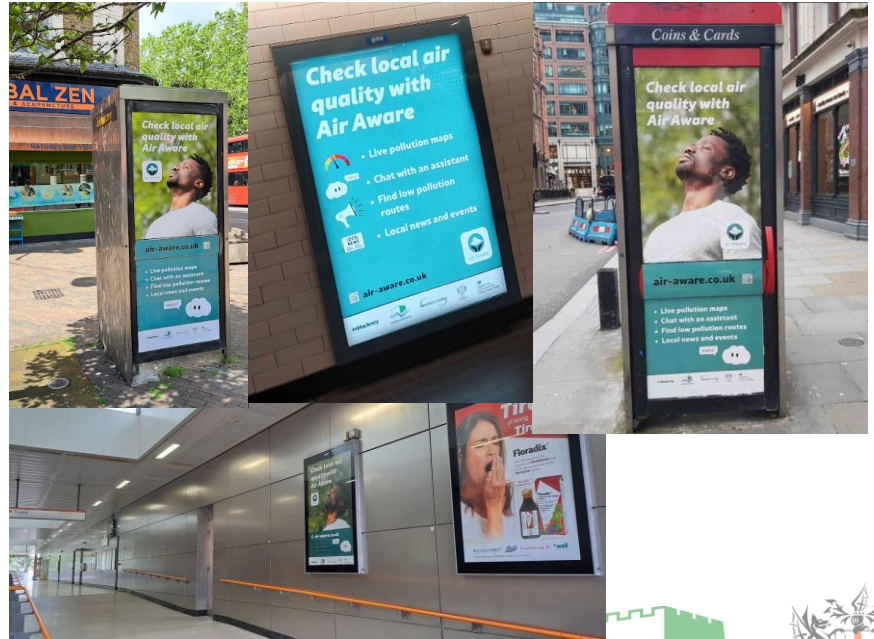


Launch of Air Aware

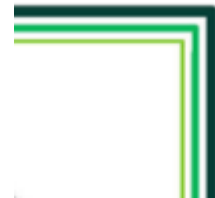

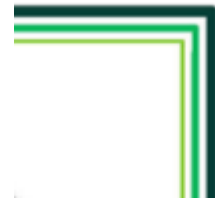
