

WBC Bin Policy requires residents to;

- 1. Place your wheeled bin out on your normal collection day, but not before 5pm the day before.
- 2. ALL rubbish must be inside the correct wheeled bin with the lid closed.
- 3. Don't leave your wheeled bin in a position that will block the way for others.
- 4. Return your wheeled bin to your property as soon as possible after collection, but no later than midnight the same day.
- 5. Glass, plastic bottles, cans, paper and cardboard must be placed loosely in the correct recycling wheeled bin provided for this purpose, for collection.
- 6. Label your bins with your house number.

You are responsible for returning and storing your allocated wheeled bins.



Warrington Issues

- No waste found
- Not in bin Residential side waste
- Bins left out contaminated & abandoned
- Waste from Social Landlord & Private tenanted properties (tenancy changeovers, brothels & 'hot bedding' shift workers)

 Using Bin Policy related interventions to improve bin and waste culture - £10k

 Surveillance Camera effectiveness in tackling fly-tipping and side waste - £25k



Bin Policy - Project

- 35,000 Bin stickers applied to bins
- Bin policy letter / s46 hand delivered
- Follow up letter to non-compliant homes
- Abandoned Bin Sticker & letter
- Remaining bins removed
- * Approx 2 week intervals



Abandoned Bins



- 1827 households targeted
- 554 abandoned bin stickers
- 285 abandoned bins removed



Positive Outcomes

- A handful of complaints about bins being 'stolen'
- Some new bin orders
- No increase in fly-tipping as a result of removed bins
- Aesthetics of areas improved
- Less time spent moving bins out of path of crews & improved bin crew safety, less risk from reversing vehicles whilst manoeuvring

Positives

- FPN
- 1 x criminal case re 2 individuals
- 1 x Simple Caution
- Deterrent effect
- Positive feedback from residents

Negatives

- Some diverted fly-tipping away from cameras
- Reliability issues with cameras

- Improving mapping of Social Landlord land
- Private Landlord Project



Engage, Educate, Enforce

- Engage via Environmental Crime Social Media; with Social Landlords over hot spots, with businesses re commercial waste contracts
- **Educate / engage** schools, community groups, voluntary sector, Parish and Town Councils to highlight key messages.
- **Educate** residents, landlords and businesses about their waste duties and responsibilities.
- Tackle repeat offenders and enforce as necessary and proportionate to do so.
