




Local Context

- Of the 52 Neighbourhoods in Stevenage, 3 are amongst the 20% most income-deprived in England.
- Average household incomes vary significantly within the town from £29,400 in the most deprived ward to £39,500 in the less deprived areas. Whilst the average salary paid in the town is £45k.
- The health of people in Stevenage is varied compared with the England and Hertfordshire averages. Circa 16% of children live in low-income families. In year 6, close to 1 in 4 of children are classified as obese, whilst 70% of adults are overweight or obese.
- Life expectancy is 5.1 years lower for men and 4.0 years lower for women in the most deprived areas of Stevenage than in the least deprived areas. 10 years difference if you compare with the likes of St Albans.
- Three key Health Inequalities: Obesity, Dementia and Mental Health










Levels of activity (Main - 3 categories) - Local Authority and County Council - Gender : Female Stevenage LA




% Levels of activity (Main - 3 categories):
