





PI 11a Total cost per lunchtime meal (excluding CEC)



This performance indicator measures the total cost per lunchtime meal. The cost includes total operational expenditure (staff, food provisions, premises, equipment, transport, supplies and services and other direct costs are included). This performance indicator excludes subsidy, capital charges and central recharges (CEC) such as central payroll, finance and IT support costs. A year-on-year increase in costs is expected with this performance indicator due to inflation.

PI 19 Average spend per paying pupil (secondary schools)




This performance indicator measures the average spend per paying secondary school pupil. This indicator uses the total discountable income, which includes income from all breakfasts, lunches and sundries but does not include milk subsidy or other grant subsidy, and is divided by the total number of pupils on the annualised school roll who are not entitled to free school meals.



- (ii) Total Unit Staff Hours (by sector)
- (iii) Total number of meals (by sector) *
- (iv) Total income (charges made)
- (v) Total staff costs
- * Break these down into (a) Prepared and served in schools/hubs, (b) prepared in schools/hubs for collection/delivery, (c) bought in for collection/delivery.

Meal uptakes

Working group felt these will be meaningless to report. Lots of free meals went to children who were not entitled to free meals under the usual criteria. FME changed from week to week as parents were affected by employment changes.

Calculating Pupil Absence will be unreliable due to 'send homes'.

Day of Count data was probably collected at least once during the year but might not be very reliable.

- Agreed to collect meal data but not pupil absence.
- Simplify 'Meal numbers served' do not ask for Free Meals Served
- Collect FME on Day of Count but do not use this to calculate 'Paying Pupil Roll' or 'Free Meal Entitlement' for uptake PI's.
- Report "Total meals served" as % of total school roll subject to reviewing the data in September.

Meal definitions

- Prepared and served in schools/hubs or bought in for serving in schools/hubs
- Prepared in schools/hubs for collection/delivery
- Bought in for collection/delivery or direct delivery from supplier.
- Exclude Meal Vouchers or direct payments to families as these will not be known by the service providers.

Other changes

Collect "PPE and other Covid related equipment as % of total expenditure"

New Covid-related absence questions

New PI - "Trading deficit for year (Expenditure - Income)"

Profile data: add Y/N fields for basis for charging for service:

- Average Free meal number from previous year trading
- Full Cost recovery (Cost Re-imbursable)
- A mixture of the above


