The Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme



- There's no such thing as a free lunch... but this pretty close!!!
- provides grants for public sector bodies to fund energy efficiency and heat decarbonisation measures.
- £1 billion scheme. England only.
- funds from BEIS and managed by Salix.
- scheme supports net zero and clean growth objectives; recovery from Covid-19 plan; 30,000 jobs in low carbon and energy efficiency sectors.
- technologies that directly contribute to the heat decarbonisation of a building by installation of low carbon heating. For example, heat pumps and connections to low carbon heat networks.
- other works insulation, glazing, ventilation, metering, electrical infrastructure, battery storage, gas-fired CHP and gas boiler replacement projects.

The Public Sector Low Carbon Skills Fund



- Funding to engage specialist and expert advice to identify and develop energy
 efficiency and low carbon heat upgrade projects for non-domestic buildings, and
 prepare robust and effective applications Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme.
- apply for funding to engage the specialist and expert advice and skills required to enable the delivery of projects funded by the main grant scheme.
- funding to put in place a Heat Decarbonisation Plan or to improve an existing plan.
- Addresses capacity and expertise gaps in many local authorities.
- But tight schedule for applications and work.

4th Dec Skills Fund; 11th Jan Decarb Fund; Sept 2021 for the works to be completed.
