








Q4: Do you feel your worklife balance has changed since lockdown on March 2020


Q5: Do you feel your productivity has increased since first lockdown started?


Q6: If you had a choice in the future would you prefer to go back to work in an office in the future?




Q14: Have you home schooled children during lockdown?

In what ways has the Coronavirus Crisis caused you to think more about the asset challenge process and how you might seek to repurpose parts or the whole of buildings to help support local economy, regeneration and communities?

'The crisis has certainly has triggered that thought process. But views are largely based on crystal ball gazing at present rather than insights. It's very difficult to project actual post-pandemic trends. So many variables here - economic and social?'

'We might need to repurpose parts of buildings but also we may not need some. Digital advancements will change delivery models to some extent.'

'It has highlighted that there are opportunities to either reduce our corporate estate and make savings or utilise our buildings working with the private and public sector to repurpose our buildings where they are in central locations to support local people e.g. training centres, higher education settings'

In what ways has the Coronavirus Crisis changed your organisation's attitude/approach to climate change and the environmental agenda? Particularly we would be interested in how environmental considerations would play a fundamental part of your organisation's recovery approach. Please provide any examples (you might for instance now see remote working as more acceptable and clear way to help improve the carbon footprint of your office stock if you are now able to reduce the number of desks and space you need)

'Management and many staff now see remote working as more acceptable some see this as an environmental benefit with less staff commuting. Also cutting the footprint of the estate should give environmental benefits that the Council would like to pursue in their plan to cut carbon. Also, as we look at alterations to make buildings more suitable for agile/remote working assessment of the building fabric/heating to introduce energy saving insulation and systems.'

'Already have a climate agenda and flexible working will contribute towards this; Possible reduction in physical working space, reduced travel to meetings, reduced use of paper and printing'

If your organisation has declared a Climate Emergency (or other similar declaration/policy/approach), how has the strategy and/or plan as it relates to property and assets, been affected by the Coronavirus Crisis?

'Renewable energy projects have increased e.g. retrofitting technologies to reduce carbon footprint'

'Impact on capacity and speed to deliver climate change and environmental projects, reduced progress on these as staff focusing on impact of Covid on property assets.'

How does your organisation intend to utilise its own assets to support or drive town centre/high street/community recovery following on from the Covid-19 pandemic?

'We intend to use our assets to support economic recovery and regeneration schemes across the borough. Our economic recovery plan outlines how we will do this through repurposeng or investment in new schemes.'

'Incentivising private sector and providing support where market failure occurs.'
