The seminar will show how we can emerge from this current crisis with better services, clearer strategic aims and with a greater desire to improve the way our lives impact on our local environment and the wider planet.

This pandemic has been a major wake-up call to society and the lessons we have learned need to be the catalyst to a brighter future.
