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About the IGNITION project

The IGNITION Project aims to **encourage innovation** and enable **investment in nature-based solutions** to climate change. Increasing urban green infrastructure to ensure the city region is resilient to the impacts of climate change.

IGNITION is a three-year project due for completion in April 2022 involving 12 partners backed by £4 million from the EU's Urban Innovation Actions initiative.



























Greater Manchester Parks Survey

The IGNITION Greater Manchester (GM) Parks and Greenspace User Survey ran from July to October 2020.

Aim: To gather data on how parks users currently value public parks and greenspaces, and how they think they should be supported.


- The survey was a joint project between the RHS Salford City Council and Greater Manchester Combined Authority (RHS are the data holders).
- A total of 2,184 surveys were completed
 1734 respondents provided postcode data which confirms they are GM residents.







Q. How often have you visited this park or greenspace during the last month? [Oct-July 2020]





Q. How important to you is being able to access public parks and greenspaces during the COVID-19 restrictions?




Q. How much do you value public parks and greenspaces compared with before the COVID-19 restrictions?


Q. Have you visited public parks and greenspaces more or less often than before COVID-19 restrictions?




Q. Although local authorities will not charge for access to parks and open spaces, would you be prepared to pay for other items or services during a visit to a public park or greenspace?


Q. To support public parks and greenspaces how much in total would you be willing to spend per person per visit on services or items such as food and drinks or activities?




Q. If you would be willing to make donations to support public parks and greenspaces what would be your preferred methods?

- The majority of respondents were visiting parks at least once a week (84% July to October 2020)
- Parks have played a vital role during lockdown, 97% of people who replied felt being able to access parks and greenspaces during COVID restrictions was of importance
- 62% of respondents were visiting parks and greenspaces more or much more compared to pre-COVID
- Parks are going to continue to play a key role in individuals lives with 92% of respondents stating that they will continue
 to visit public parks and greenspaces as frequently even after the COVID restrictions have lifted
- It was very clear that respondents felt councils should take the lead on essential maintenance (98%) and parks improvement projects (84%)
- 91% of respondents would be willing to pay for items and services and would be willing to spend between £2 and £10 per person per visit
- Most would be willing to make a donation to support a park or greenspace with only 15% stating they would not want to make a donation













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
