The seminar therefore aims to show how local authorities are meeting these challenges by changing service delivery in innovative ways and using partner and community support thus allowing more sustainable services to be delivered

APSE brings together a wide variety of speakers who will debate how they have transformed policy into practice to achieve these changes. On the day we will look at:
