



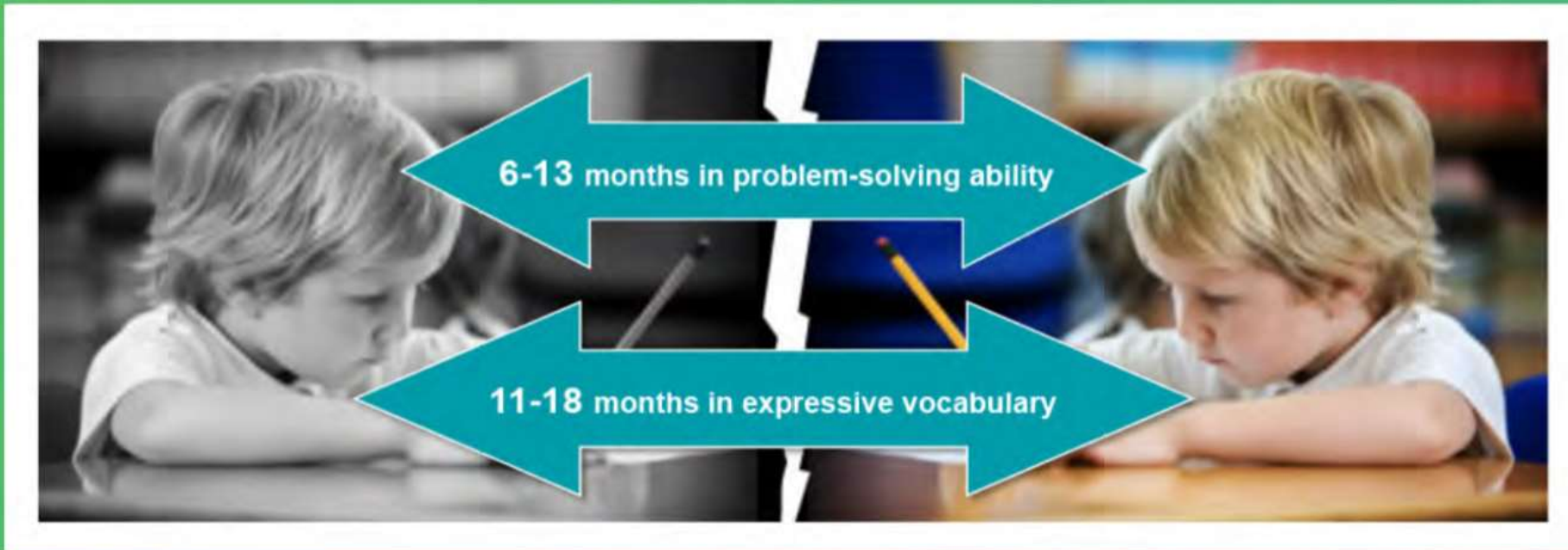

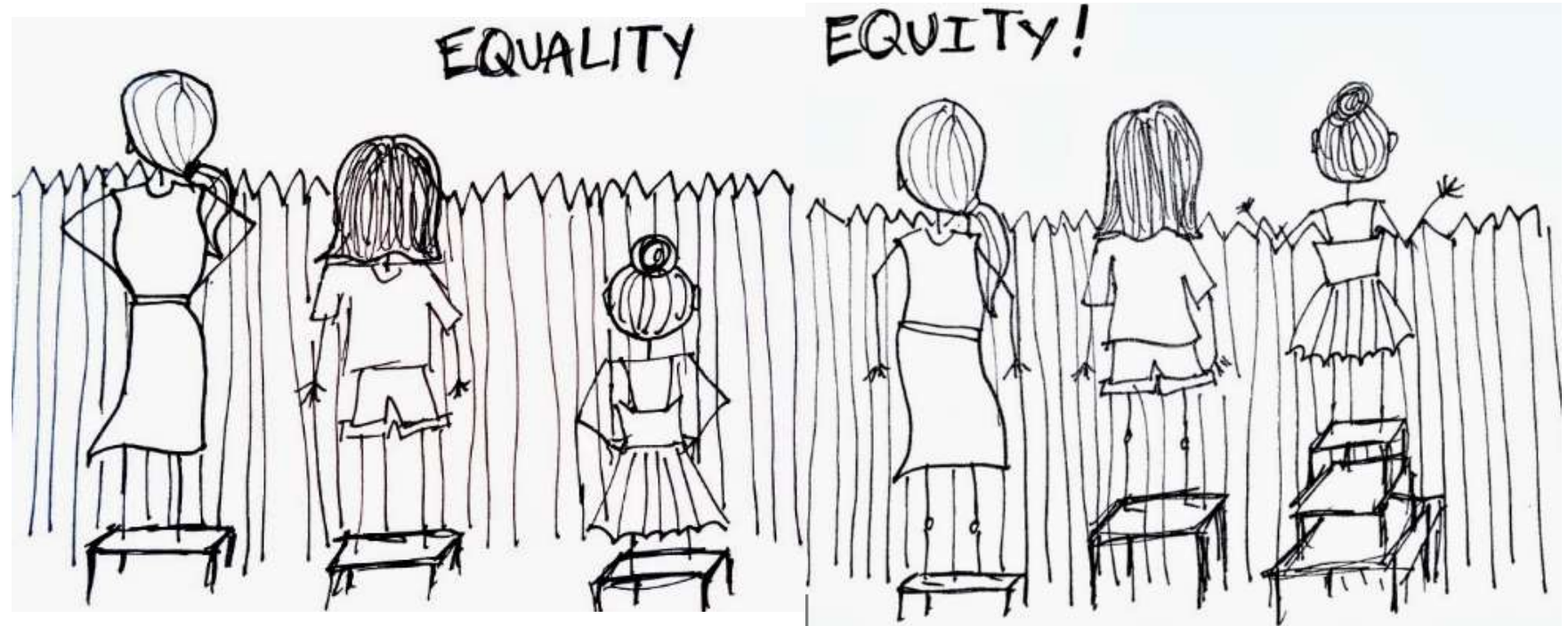
In Scotland, at age 5, the gap between children from the most advantaged and most disadvantaged families is already:

National Improvement Framework

'I am committed to raising attainment and making demonstrable progress in closing the gap in attainment between our least and most disadvantaged young people over the lifetime of this Parliament.'



The Scottish Attainment Challenge

The First Minister launched the Scottish Attainment Challenge in February 2015 to bring a greater sense of urgency and priority to this issue.

Targeted support for Literacy, Numeracy & Health & Wellbeing

Phase 1 – Nine challenge authorities (GC, DC, IC, WD, NA, C, NL, EA, R)

Phase 2 – 133 additional secondaries

Phase 3 – AA allocated to every local authority

Pupil Equity Funding

‘Pupil Equity Funding is allocated directly to schools, targeted at those children most affected by the poverty related attainment gap.

From April this year, £120 million will be provided through the Attainment Scotland Fund directly to headteachers to use for additional staffing or resources they consider will help reduce the poverty related attainment gap.

The funding will reach schools in every local authority area in Scotland and **will be distributed on the basis of the numbers of pupils in P1-S3 known to be eligible and registered for free school meals.**’

The Magic Breakfast

The evaluators found that Year 2 (P3) children in schools with a breakfast club made two additional months' progress in reading, writing and maths compared with a similar group whose schools were not given support to offer breakfast. The researchers also reported that the pupils' concentration and behaviour improved too. The evaluators suggest that breakfast clubs provide an opportunity to improve outcomes for all children, not just those who actually attend, by creating better classroom environments.

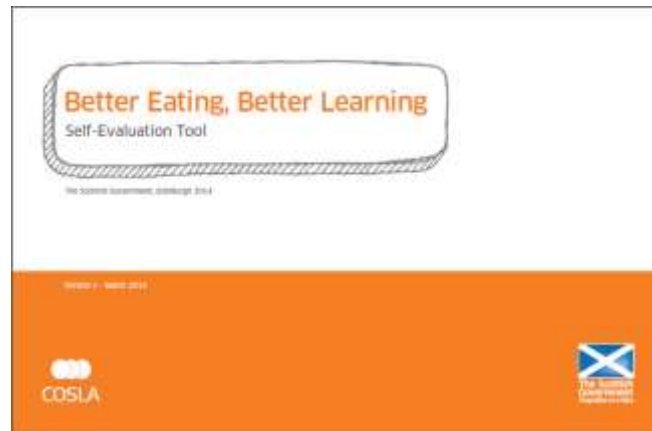
